**ARCHIVES RECORDS.**  
OTTAWA, Aug. 13—A systematic search thru all the administrative departments here in quest of valuable records is contemplated by the secretary of state, Hon. Dr. Roche, on the advice of the Dominion archivist. The search will probably be undertaken by a small commission and everything of value in the way of old records will be placed in the archives under the care of Dr. Doughty. No real effort has been made to get these documents together and it is believed that there are pigeon-holed, in all the older departments, papers of great importance as to historical and legal records. Dr. Roche favors some such system as is in force in England, where all these documents after a fixed period go as a matter of course to the archives. With this object, Hon. Dr. Roche has enlarged the manuscript committee by the addition of Hon. Thos. Chapiro, of Quebec; Archdeacon Armitage, of Halifax; Professor Chester Martin, of Manitoba university; Professor W. L. Grant, of Quebec; R. E. Connell, of British Columbia; Archdeacon Raymond, of St. John, and Sir Edmund Walker, of Toronto.

**FIREWORKS KILLS FIVE.**  
AUBURN, N. Y., Aug. 13—Five are dead as a result of an explosion of dangerous fireworks which were being prepared in the Italian Colony this morning for the celebration of the feast of the Assumption by the congregation of the Church of St. Francis d'Assisi. The dead are: Costimo D. Carmelino of Fairview, N. Y., manufacturer of fireworks, and Mrs. Mary Cheche and three children, Emma, 11; Armando, 9; and Carmela, 7.
