SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency in the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by the applicant's mother, son, daughter, brother or sister intending homesteader.

Duties: Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within ninety days of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20.00 per acre.

Duties: Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to carry out the patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20.00 per acre—Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

COLLIE SAVES WHOLE FAMILY

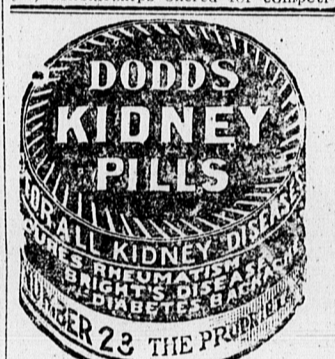

tion. On Wednesday evening, the 26th inst., Geo. W. Bailey M. D., of St. Martin's, N. B., lectured before the school, taking for his subject "Tuberculosis." He dwelt chiefly with the part that the educational authorities should do to have the people instructed in the precautionary measures that might be taken to guard against the spread of this dread disease. It was clearly shown that tuberculosis was curable, if the patient was treated in the early stages of the disease, but that when the disease was firmly rooted in the system there has not yet been discovered any treatment that may be relied upon for a cure.

Thursday evening's lecture by Judge Carleton of Woodstock, N. B., was a most enjoyable one. The subject was "Irish Wit and Humor." Beginning by describing what wit was, also what humor was, and pointing out the distinction between them, the lecturer proceeded to characterize and illustrate the wit of the several civilized peoples—German, French, English, Scotch, American. With this introduction the lecturer then took up his main subject, viz.—Irish wit and humor. The wit of all classes of the community from the simple laborer to the gentleman of culture and ease was described, and exceedingly amusing specimens were given of the wit of each class. In his wit, the Irishman is never irreverent. In no phase of wit is he happier than in repartee. "Richard Murphy went to Rome and returned a Dic-tator," is not Irish wit, as an Irishman never says "tater." All Irish wit conforms to the veracious. Many of the sayings ascribed to Pat are not genuine. For nearly two hours the lecturer held the rapt attention of his audience, who were again and again convulsed with laughter.

Friday was a day full of good things. In addition to the regular class work, there was a lecture to the classes in Physical Culture by the Examiner in that subject. At three o'clock p. m. Mrs. Dunbrack of the Department of Agriculture for New Brunswick lectured to the school on Women's Institutes. In these Institutes much good work is being done to make the people more contented with conditions in the rural districts.

The female teachers present urged to identify themselves with these Institutes and give their influence towards forwarding their objects.

At 8 o'clock p. m. an Agricultural meeting was held, addressed by Mr. Hubbard, Secretary of Agriculture for N. B., and Mr. Turney, Orchardist for the Province. In both these addresses the vast, undeveloped resources of the Maritime Provinces both in the way of general farming and in apple growing, were emphasized. The tendency from the farm was deplored. In commenting upon the addresses Chancellor Jones of the University of New Brunswick suggested that the trend from the farm might be checked if our young lady teachers, who were now almost monopolizing the profession, should decide to take life partners from amongst the farmers' sons. If they should do so he advised them to insist upon two things—First that the house should be furnished with a war system, and that a telephone should be installed.
