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GREAT VICTORY BY POLES OVER BOLSHEVIK FORCES

Recaptured Kiev from Red Army, Took Thousands of Provisions. Bolshevik Forces Demoralized.

(Dom. Press Special.)
CONSTANTINOPLE, June 16.—Polish forces have retaken Kiev in a strong counter attack upon the Bolsheviks, according to a despatch received here today. The Poles inflicted heavy casualties on the Red army. General Wrangel, leader of the anti-Soviet forces in the Crimea, has made considerable progress on the Dnieper River. The

cavalry attached to Wrangel's right wing have reached Melitopol. Advances here said Red armies had become demoralized and that Wrangel had taken thousands of prisoners in his rapid forward movement. On the northern front the Poles continue to progress. A stubborn battle was fought near Perekop, both Poles and Red forces losing heavily.

Eight Killed In Train Wreck

LE JUNG, (OLO), June 16.—Eight persons are reported killed and fifty injured near Reno, Colorado, today when the east bound Santa Fe train "California Limited" was wrecked. Relief trains carrying doctors and nurses have been dispatched to the scene.

Resolutions have been adopted acknowledging the authority of the Sinn Fein parliament and congratulating Irish Republican Army on its manifold successes and calling upon the army to protect lives and property of citizens. Copies of these resolutions have been forwarded to the Governments in Europe and the United States.

Pitched Battle In Ireland

DUBLIN, June 16.—A pitched battle occurred between a group of armed Sinn Feiners and British soldiers at Ballinacorney Camp near Dumanway in which many shots were exchanged. The raiders were finally driven off. No report was available as to whether there had been casualties.

Still Trying to Form German Cabinet

BERLIN, June 16.—Dr. Seiffner, leader of the Democratic Party, today accepted President Ebert's request that he make an effort to form a new cabinet, following the failure of Karl Trimborn, Centrist, to bring the oppositing political factions into the government.

Three Negroes Were Lynched

(Dom. Press Special.)
DULUTH, Minn., June 16.—State guards due here early today were expected to prevent further race troubles, following a night of rioting in which a mob of 5,000 lynched three negroes held in connection with an attack on a 17 year old white girl. The mob destroyed the city jail, capturing six negroes held for the offense. Three of the accused were found "not guilty" at a mock trial before the lynchings. Not a shot was fired in the mob demonstrations.

Police Inspector Is Shot Dead

CORRY COUNTY WEXFORD, IRELAND, June 16.—Police Inspector Captain Wilson has been shot dead by five armed men. Seven shots were fired at him.

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NATIONAL COUNCIL OF
WOMEN AT ST. JOHN.

ST. JOHN, June 16.—The Executive of the National Council of Women made the final preparations this morning for the opening of the 79th annual convention at noon. 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FURTHER EVIDENCE IN ELLIS MURDER CASE

Sixth Day of Trial Elicits Important Evidence. Coroner Pate Relates Conversation with Prisoner.

Further testimony by neighbors, members of the coroner's jury and police officers marked the sixth day of the Crown's case in the Ellis murder trial at Summerside yesterday. The most interesting evidence was that of Coroner Pate who repeated the prisoner's statement at the inquest.

Italians Defeated By Albanians

(Dom. Press Special.)
ROME, June 16.—Italian casualties in the recent fighting at Valona numbered ten killed, fifty wounded and 1,000 taken prisoners by the Albanians, according to a news despatch today. The message said the Albanians were concentrating their forces for a new attack upon the city. The Italian commander of the garrison at Valona has notified the government that he will be able to meet further attacks by Albanians as strong reinforcements have arrived and measures have been taken to suppress uprising by Albanian population. Albanians are under the command of the Turkish Nationalist leader, Mustapha Kemal Pasha.

Radical Reforms Proposed by A.F.L.

(Special to The Guardian.)
MONTREAL, June 16.—Full approval was voted in executive council of the American Federation of Labor for its program to require voting costs and full profits. The program provided for the confiscation of practically all war profits for four years back, establishment of a government agency to administer credits and sale by government at cost of standard necessities. Part of the program was contained in demands presented to the Republican National convention. Under the convention plans the program also will be presented to the Annual Convention at San Francisco.

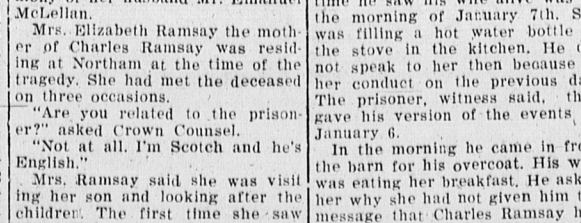
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THE WEATHER. TEMPERATURE TIDE, MOON ETC.

H.M.S. CALCUTTA ARRIVES THIS MORNING

Arrangements Made for Fishing Trip, An At Home by Navy League and Daughters of the Empire, Golf Games etc.

His Honor Lieutenant Governor McKinnon received a wireless yesterday from H. M. S. Calcutta, announcing that she would arrive at Charlottetown this morning at 7 o'clock. The message also stated that Lady Maud McIntosh and Miss Schofield, were on board as passengers and had expressed the hope that the visit here might include a fishing trip. His Honor is making arrangements accordingly. Mr. J. O. Hyndman, Secretary of the Navy League, extended an invitation to the officers of the ship on behalf of the Navy League and the Daughters of the Empire and an At Home at Government House, Friday night. A wireless dispatch was received last evening from the Commanding Officer accepting the invitation, and also stating that the ship's band would be placed at the disposal of the Navy League.

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Arrangements are also being made for golf games, automobile drives etc. As this is the first ship of the British Navy that has honored the port with a call for some time, it is very creditable that no time has been lost in arranging for the entertainment of the visitors to whom all Canadians are so much indebted for their continuous vigil and sacrifice. 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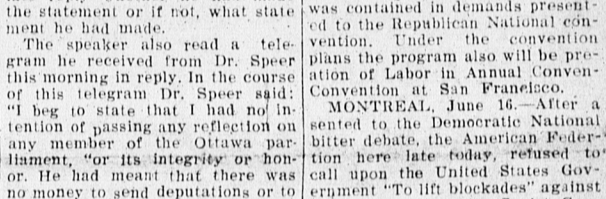
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
