Livestock

MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—(CP)—There were 378 cattle, 80 sheep and lambs, 1,113 hogs and 344 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today. Prices on all classes of livestock were steady. Today's receipts were made up of common quality cows. A few medium cows made around \$4.50 to \$5 with common butchers \$3.75 to \$4.25. Carriers and cutters \$2.50 to \$3.50. Common bulls \$3.50 to \$4.25. Veal calves ranged from \$8.50 to \$11 with a few tops at \$1.50. Drinkers \$5.50 to \$8 and grassers mostly \$4.75 ranging from \$4.50 to \$5. Good ewes and wethers were \$9.75 to \$10. Culls and bucks \$7.75 to \$8, and sheep \$3.50 to \$5. Hogs were sold at \$10.75 for B-1 dressed, \$8.25 for B-1 alive fed and watered and up to \$8.35 off trucks. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with "count" on off grades. Sows were \$5 to \$6.

Grain

WINNIPEG, Nov. 19.—(CP)—Wheat futures prices showed no change today in featureless trade on the Winnipeg grain exchange. At the close values were unchanged with December at 72, May 76 1-4 and July 77 7-8. Bids Aires was a fraction off at noon. In the cash wheat market a large quantity of no. 1 northern was sold in eastern Canada and United States ports. Some estimates placed the sales as high as 1,000,000 bushels. Prices moved within a narrow range in the coarse grains market, and trade volume was small. Grain close: Wheat: Dec 72B, May 76 1-4B, July 77 7-8B. Oats: Dec 34, May 32 3-4, July 31 7-4A. Barley: Dec 45 5-8, May 43 7-8B, July 42B.

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—(AP)—Wheat futures rallied in the last hour today and prices reached the best levels of the session, advancing as much as 5-8 cent a bushel above yesterday's close. Wheat closed unchanged to 1-4 cent higher, Dec 89-90 7-8, May 88 3-4-1-4, corn was 1-4-5-8 up, Dec 64 7-8-65, May 65 1-4-3-8, and oats were unchanged to 1-2 up. Soybeans also dipped in the final few minutes, all deliveries closing at or near the day's lowest levels, off 3-4-3-4 cents.

CURRENCIES

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—(CP)—A decline of 1-10 cent in the free Argentine peso and a gain of 1-8 cent in the Canadian dollar high-lighted quiet dealings in the foreign money market today. The peso closed at 23.50 cents and the Canadian dollar at a discount of 1-8 per cent in relation to the United States dollar. (Ottawa exchange control board rate 9.09-9.91 per cent discount.) The free pound sterling fell unchanged at \$4.04.

FINANCE

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—(AP)—Stocks steadied in today's market. In the Canadian section Bell Telephone advanced 4 points to 111 and Power Corporation 1 point to 5. Distillers Seagram, International Nickel and Imperial were easy. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off 1.1 of a point at 43.4. Transfers of 720,600 shares compared with 574,050 the day before.

Financial circles were given a pleasant surprise by Santa Fe directors who voted a payment of \$1 on the common. It was the first disbursement on this issue since September, 1937, when \$2 was declared. The junior stock climbed 1 1-2 points to 18 1-2 and the preferred issue was up 3 at 58 1-4, a new top for the year. The Republic Steel board announced regular quarterly dividends of \$1.50 each on its two preferred stocks which rose 1 5-8 and 3 points, respectively. The common finished 1-8 higher.

Chairman Gardner said he thought the steel industry would run "full" through 1941 but that "it depends a lot on Hitler and Wunsion Churchill." U.S. Steel was unchanged, Bethlehem down 1-8 and Youngstown Sheet up 1-2. On the offside were Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Du Pont, Johns-Manville, Anaconda, Kennecott, Douglas Aircraft, Eastern Air Lines and N.Y. Central. Among gainers were Certain-Teed and International Paper preferred, Texas Corp., Standard Oil of N.J., General Motors, Chrysler, U.S. Rubber, Great Northern, American Telephone and General Electric.

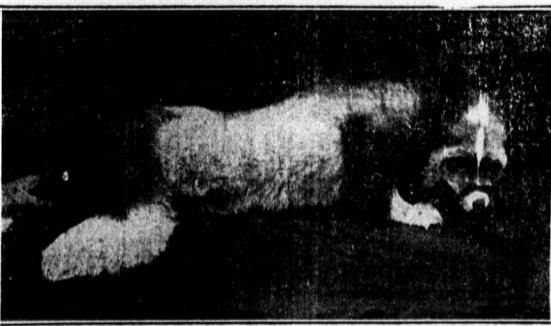
