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THE COOK'S CORNER

Dinner Fruit Salad 3 ripe bananas 3 slices pineapple 1 grapefruit 1 cup seeded grapes Lettuce

Cheese dressing Method: Peel and slice the bananas and dribble over them the juice from the grapefruit. Then keep them from turning dark. Cut the pineapple in small pieces and peel the grapefruit. Separate into sections and remove the seeds and the white membrane from each section.

Mix the fruit and let stand in a cold place until you are ready to serve them. Heap on generous beds of lettuce and top with a spoonful of cheese dressing, which is simply mayonnaise or boiled dressing to which has been added 1-2 cup of cottage cheese.

BUTTERSQUOTCH PUDDING Combine 4 1-2 tablespoons corn starch very thoroughly with 1 1-8 cups brown sugar (not packed) and 3-4 teaspoon salt. Slowly stir in 3 cups hot milk; return to do-b's boiler and stir and cook until mixture thickens. Cover and mix with occasional stirring, until no raw flavor remains.
