ONTARIO FOLLOWS LEAD OF MARITIME PROVINCES. The apple growers of Ontario are beginning to bestir themselves and not without reason. It is estimated that the value of the apple crop in Ontario averages about \$7,000,000 annually from seven million bearing trees—an average of \$1.00 per tree. If the production were brought up to that of the apple orchards of New York State, the value of the crop would average over \$50,000,000 annually. According to the October issue of the Canadian Horticulturist, of Peterboro, Ont., this shows the great possibilities of the apple industry in Ontario and the need of the adoption of measures aiming at improved conditions. Several reasons are mentioned as being responsible for this poor showing, chief of which is failure to realize the damage done by insect pests and diseases, and lack of knowledge regarding the best ways to combat these evils. In adopting measures to overcome this condition the Ontario government is commencing to follow somewhat the same system as has been in force for some time in the Maritime Provinces, by establishing "demonstration orchards" operated under the control of the department of agriculture. Already excellent results are being shown and a few years will without doubt see these "demonstration orchards" being operated in all parts of the Province.
