Prices Firm After Hesitant Start

MONTREAL, Dec. 4—After a hesitant start, prices firmed in transactions today on the stock exchange and curb market and at the bell increases held a good lead over losses. Dividend announcements helped promote the upswing. Gains ran counter to the general trend and were to a new 1946 low in the indices.

Profiting by dividend declarations were Dosco, which opened lower, D. Bridge and T. Pains Preferred in Industrials. Others in the group firmed were Asbestos, C. Car. C. Packers "A", Foundries, H. Bridge, C. Locomotive, Electrolux, N. S. Car, E. Steel and Massey Preferred. Losers were Steico Preferred, B. Products, I. Bronze Preferred, C. Packers "B", Fleet, Algoma, Cockshutt and D. Engineering, Celanese, which also got a lift from a dividend statement, was higher, and C. Cottons lagged in textiles.

Among beverages, ahead were Seagrams, Molson, C. and N. Breweries, Alco "A" and "B" and Walkers.

Brazilian converted a loss into a rise in utilities, Winnipeg Electric also pushed up. Shawinigan surrendered an increase and down were Bell, B. C. Power "A", C. N. Power and Gatineau. Nationale slipped in banks, Provincial Transport, C.P.R. and Steamship work- ed higher in carriers.

In the paper division, on the outside were St. Lawrence Paper Preferred, Price, Fraser, Donna- con, International, Consolidated, Abitibi, M. & C. O. B. and Common and Bathurst. Off were St. Lawrence "A", B. C. Forest and Brown Preferred.

Aluminum, Smelters and Nickel improved in metals and H. B. Mining lagged. Hollinger, Eater, C. Cadillac, Joliet, Ling- man, Sarrage and Sherbit, Zan- Sullivan and Sullivan wiped out deficits. Softer were Parquette, Band Ore and Goldbeam.

Argus, Odeville and Acme were harder in miscellaneous and shad- ed were Accenteaux, Southern, Lumber and Chemicals.

Sharp Rally Noted On N. Y. Market

(By T. E. Applegate, Associated Press Financial Writer)

NEW YORK, Dec. 4—(AP)—Wall Street backed its bid for an early coal strike settlement with one of the sharpest rallies in more than a month in today's stock market. Leading shares closed 1 to around 3 points higher after extreme gains were shaded by late profit taking.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 8 of a point on the day at 63.5 equalling its best advance since Nov. 1.

Canadian stocks advanced fractionally with Hiram Walker in the lead with a gain of 1/4. U. S. Steel was ahead 2 1/4 at 53 1/4. Chrysler up 1 at 53. General Motors 1 at 50 1/2. Goodrich 1 3/4 at 62 1/2. Kennecott 1 7/8 at 69. Santa Fe 1 1/2 at 90 1/2. Chesapeake and Ohio 1 3/8 at 53 1/4. and Texas Co. 1 5/8 at 59 5/8.

Others prominently higher were Youngstown Sheet, Goodyear, Montgomery Ward, Woolworth, Caterpillar Tractor, Douglas Aircraft, Southern Pacific, Northern Pacific, Du Pont, Fenny Stores, Owens-Illinois, General Electric, Dow Chemical, Westinghouse, Johns-Manville and Union Carbide.
