Fine Recital at Stanley Bridge

Following is the program as announced by Miss Mary MacNeill of Cavendish at the recital by the pupils of Miss Lena MacLure, A.T.C.M. held in Stanley Hall, Stanley, Friday, Sept. 29th. Ladies and Gentlemen: We wish to thank you for coming this evening. The opening number on our program is "O Canada" and "The Island Hymn", sung by the class. The accompanist is Miss Clemmie Simpson.

In presenting our fourth annual recital we considered the brief excerpt from Fiona MacLeod's "Mountain Lovers" freely expressed the regularity of our autumnal recitals. One might almost think Fiona MacLeod wrote of our own beautiful Island province in the following rhythmic prose: "Morning and afternoon, afternoon and evening, night and the passing of night, dawn and sunrise, these were the ways; the wind rose to curtain off this spot of earth. And as one spring was like another spring and one autumn like another autumn, so was one year like another year in the coming and in the going."
