INTERCOLONIAL TRAIN SERVICE.

For the purpose of quick and easy travel to and from Prince Edward Island from outside points the Intercolonial train service now in operation is admirable, and is a decided improvement over previous years.

Passengers can under present arrangements leave St. John at 11.00 or Halifax at 12.30 and reach Charlottetown by the shorter routes respectively the same day. Or they can leave Halifax at 8.10 a. m. and take the more circuitous route via Moncton and Point du Chene and still reach this city in the evening. In like manner by taking the 6 a. m. train from St. John a passenger can reach this city in the evening, after going all the way round by way of Pictou.

Of course most passengers from St. John or Halifax or points beyond, will travel by the trains leaving near midday, and by the most direct route. Others may have business which may make it desirable to take one of the longer routes and to these it will be highly satisfactory to be able to come through to their destination on the Island the same day. Such persons cannot very well object to the rather early hour at which they must leave St. John or Halifax.

Japan is formulating a new tariff on a high protection basis, so far as manufactured goods are concerned.

Sir Charles Tupper was born at Amherst on July 2nd 1821, and has now entered on his 85th year. He entered public life as the representative of Cumberland County in 1855, fifty-one years ago. No living man has to the same extent left the impress of his mind on the institutions of Canada.

We are disposed to insist that Hon. Daniel Gordon is entitled to rank as a full-fledged eminent Islander. His faithful public course, his fine ability, his orate public speeches, his genial spirit, his youthful vigor in what to most others would be called old age, are so many marks of eminence. He holds a high place in the esteem and regard of a wide circle of the Island people.

Winnipeg has great apparent faith in municipal ownership. By a large majority its citizens have approved a bylaw empowering the city to construct a power plant at a cost of \$3,500,000. The scheme is to utilize water power at a distance and supply electric energy for manufacturing purposes at cost. At the same election a majority was given in favor of a ninth be street cars on Sundays.

SUPREME COURT.

Hurry vs McDonald. This case was called yesterday before Mr Justice Hodgson and a Jury. The action was for an alleged libel contained on a postal card received by the plaintiff. After the plaintiff's principal witness had been under cross examination for some time an adjournment of the Court for dinner took place, and at its reopening the plaintiff's counsel asked the Court for a non-suit which was granted.

Pendergrast vs Jardine. Action for a trespass to a mud digging machine and for trover. This case commenced after dinner hour yesterday before Mr Justice Hodgson and a Jury, and at the hour of adjournment the plaintiff's side was not closed.
