TRIAL OF UNITED WIRELESS OFFICIALS

NEW YORK, May 3.—The trial of the officers and directors of the United Wireless Telegraph Company in the United States Circuit Court for alleged misuse of the mails, was featured today by the introduction of an agreement said to have been executed between the Wireless Company and the New York selling agency, by which agency was to share the profits of sales of wireless stock. In two instances, it was testified the officers of both concerns were the same.

Chris. Columbus Wilson, President of the Wireless Company and S. S. Bogal, former Vice-President, as incorporators of the selling agency shared in the profits to the selling agency from the sale of United Wireless stock, according to testimony given by Francis M. Mason, who said that for seven months he had charge of the selling campaign in New York. The Government charges that these profits approximated \$2,000,000, but no evidence upon that point was adduced.

REAL FIGHT OVER FREE LIST BILL

WASHINGTON, May 5.—Recognizing that the real fight over the Free List Bill will come on Monday, leaders of both parties in the House today issued preparatory orders to absent members to return at once to Washington.

The Bill will be taken up then for amendment under the five minute debate rule. The measure has been before the House nearly two weeks, and the general debate has run on without limit.
