SOVIET PRESS MAKE CHARGES AGAINST U.S.

States that Americans Trying To Drive Russia Into War With Japan.

MOSCOW, Nov. 24—The newspapers Ivestia and Pravda laid down an editorial barrage today, charging that the United States is trying to drive the Soviet Union into war with Japan for the fourfold purpose of undermining the five-year plan, getting orders for military equipment, weakening Japanese competition in the Pacific and setting up a Manchurian buffer state against Bolshevism.

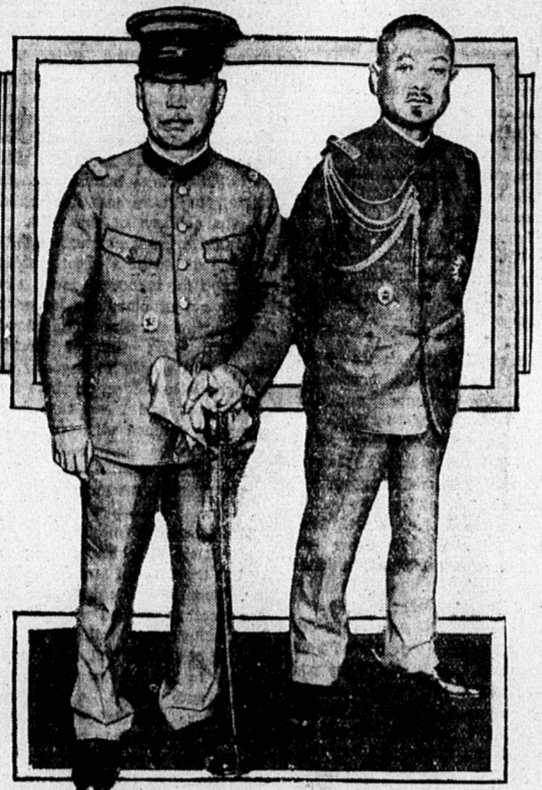
Conciliation Board Inquiry

Great Response To Service Loan More Than Sixty Million Dollars Of New Bond Issue Taken Up By Investors.

MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 24—The first day's subscriptions to the National Service Loan of the Dominion of Canada totalling over \$60,000,000, according to official reports issued today by the general management committee. While the committee was unable to issue official figures on today's returns, it was believed that half of the \$150,000,000 five per cent loan had been taken up by investors.
