**GRAHAM BELL'S WHITE WINGS**

Successful Test Of Flying Machine Built For U. S. Government.

ELMIRA, N. Y., May 14—A despatch from Hammondsport, says—Professor Alexander Graham Bell's flying machine "White Wings," which he is making for the United States Government, made a successful flight near this city today. Professor Bell was accompanied on the aerial voyage by Lieut. Selfridge of the United States Signal Corps who has been detailed to inspect the experiments. The machine is heavier than air.

**DINNER WAITED FOR CONSTABLE**

Rich Mrs. Vanderbilt Hel Up For Speeding Automobile on Road

HARTSDALE, N. Y., May 14—Mrs. Cornelius Vanderbilt and several friends from Manhattan, who were on the way yesterday morning to dine with friends at Mount Kisco, were much perturbed when Mrs. Vanderbilt's automobile was stopped by a constable, A. P. Townsend, in Central Avenue, for violating the speed law. Townsend said the car was travelling twenty-eight miles an hour.

When the constable told Mrs. Vanderbilt he would have to take the chauffeur before Judge Glover, at Ardsley, seven miles away, she became indignant. She said she was in a hurry to reach Mount Kisco, where she was to dine at one o'clock. It was half past twelve, and she told the constable that it would be an outrage to take the machine back to Ardsley.

Though she pleaded earnestly the constable became more obdurate. Mrs. Vanderbilt called up Sheriff Charles M. Lance, of Westchester county, at his home at Pleasantville and explained her predicament. He had no control over the constable but suggested that Townsend might accept cash bail. This he did not do, but took the chauffeur before Judge Glover, who paroled him in Mrs. Vanderbilt's custody on her promise.
