# PROHIBITION DEMANDED.

On Friday evening May 5th, 1899, the monthly meeting of the Free Temperance Society was held in the hall at Glenwood Lot 8. The president, Michael McDonald, in the chair. The attendance was good. The meeting was opened singing and prayer.

The programme consisted of recitations, by John McDonald, Ida Torril, Lottie McDonald, Annie Crawford, and Laura Wait. The recitation by Miss Crawford was especially good; but all did well. The reading by Mr. Malcolm McKenzie teacher, "An oration by King Alcohol" was loudly applauded.

Temperance speeches were made by Rev. D. MacLean and Mr. Isaac McDonald and after some discussion the following resolution was moved by Rev. D. MacLean, seconded by Mr. Arthur Boyle, and carried unanimously.

Resolved, that the Free Temperance Society express disapproval of the course pursued by the Dominion Government in refusing to enact prohibitory legislation in accordance with the wish of the people, as declared by the Plebiscite vote in September last.

Here a considerable discussion took place relative to the course pursued by the Dominion Government with regard to the plebiscite vote. The speakers were Andrew Livingston, Alfred Gorrill, Arthur Boyle, Isaac MacDonald, the president, and Rev. D. MacLean.

The speakers allowed that the Laurier Government did well to grant the Plebiscite; but at the same time, prohibitionists, who were victorious at the polls, are not content to reap the benefit of a defeat. Nor was it considered fair that one province with a majority vote should rule the whole Dominion though they regretted that prohibitory legislation for the whole Dominion is refused.

HALIFAX, May 23.—A Physician accidentally came across a case of leprosy yesterday. The person afflicted with the terrible disease is a married woman residing on the road near Annapolis. The doctor stated that it was one of the worst cases of leprosy he had ever seen.

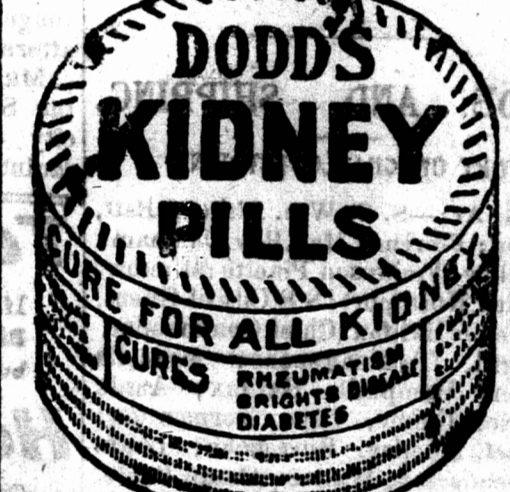
