Sunday School Convention At Cape Wolfe Church

The annual meeting of the O'Leary-Alberton Sunday School district was held in the Cape Wolfe United Church on Friday afternoon and night, Nov. 4th, under the auspices of the Maritime Religious Education Council. The guest speaker was Rev. John Jarvie of Sackville, N. B., Field Secretary for Christian Education for the United Church in the Maritime Conference. Another welcome visitor was Miss Elma Inman of Tryon, P. E. I., missionary on furlough from Trinidad who brought greetings from the Trinidad Sunday School Association. She has been in Trinidad since 1940.

Despite torrential rains, which never let up all afternoon and evening combined with heavy winds and slippery roads there was an attendance of 43 in the afternoon and 50 at night. The O'Leary-Alberton Convention takes in some twenty-two Sunday Schools in the Alberton, O'Leary Cape district. The afternoon session began with a splendid worship service conducted by the president, Mr. Earl Jelly B. A., teacher at the Unionvale School. The secretary Mrs. Mattie Hodgson of Alberton then called the roll of the Sunday Schools present and delegates gave reports of their Schools.

Rev. W.G. Dickson, O'Leary, called the attention of the Convention to the fine service of his Superintendent, Mr. A. J. Matheson of O'Leary who has been the conscientious, efficient and faithful Sunday School Superintendent for fifty-one (51) years. Under Mr. Matheson's wise guidance, the O'Leary Sunday School with the enrollment of over one hundred is the largest in the Convention and one of the largest in the province. Rev. Mr. Dickson moved that the convention send a letter of congratulations to Mr. Matheson on his outstanding service of over half a century to Christian Education in O'Leary. This was unanimously agreed to by the Convention.

Rev. Mr. Jarvie then spoke on the reports submitted. He commended the teachers for the fine work which is being done. He noted that there was no Leadership Training in any of the Sunday Schools and asked the delegates to take steps to have one or more Leadership Training schools established. Mr. Russell Leard of Cascumpec was appointed Convenor of the Nominating Committee and Rev. W. G. Dickson Convenor of the Resolutions Committee and Press Reporter. Rev. Mr. Jarvie then spoke on the theme: "Building Today for a Better Tomorrow." The ladies of Cape Wolfe served a chicken supper in the Temperance Hall. During the supper session besides the fine remarks of Miss Inman on Trinidad, Mrs. Watson Silliker of O'Leary sang several solos and in the evening meeting Mrs. Silliker and Mrs. Russell Leard, Cascumpec, sang a fine duet and Rev. J. M. Sheen of Elmsdale was heard to advantage in a well rendered solo.

The evening session began with a worship service conducted by Rev. C. O. Howlett of O'Leary. Rev. Mr. Dickson reported on the Resolutions Committee and recommended that a Leadership Training School be held in the winter, weather, and roads permitting. Mr. Russell Leard reported for Nominating Committee and said that all the officers would be recommended for re-election as follows: President: Earl Jelly; 1st Vice-President: Russell Leard; 2nd Vice-President: John Mountain; 3rd Vice-President: Mrs. William Stewart, Secretary-Treasurer: Mrs. Mattie Hodgson.

Rev. Mr. Jarvie brought the convention to a close by a fine address on how God is trying his people and measuring them with a plumb line as recommended by the prophet Amos. Rev. B. C. Colborne, West Cape, pronounced the Benediction.—O
