and the Food Ration necessary for the
most Economical Production of Milk. The
paper was discussed at length by Messrs.

Joseph Read, North Bedeque. The fol-
lowing officers were elected. President,
Thomas J. Humphrey, of Wilnot; Sec-
retary-Treasurer, John A. Jardine, Lower
Freetown; Delegates to the Central As-
sociation to be held in June next, Messrs.
Gordon Schurman, David Rogers and
Charles Craig. A public meeting was
held in the evening which was largely
attended. The question of the Stock Farm
was discussed from a non-political stand-
point. The consensus of opinion appear-
ed to be that as a stock farm it had out-
lived its usefulness and that an effort
should be made to induce the Dominion
Government to purchase it and use it as
an Experimental Farm for P. E. Island.
As our soil and climatic conditions are dif-
ferent from the mainland. This question
will be considered again at the next meet-
ing of this Branch.
