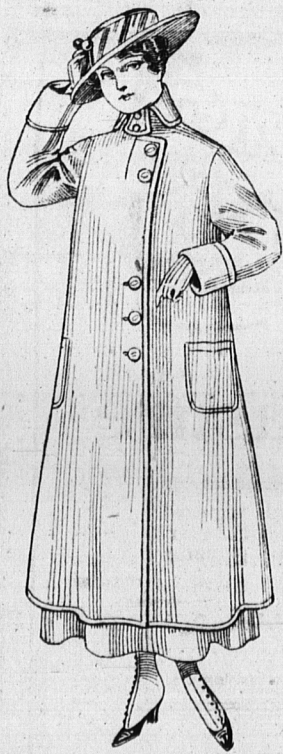
PLUM PUDDING.
