Method: Blackberries will probably be sweetened so we're adding only a little extra sugar. If they are very sweet, maybe you won't want any more. Drain off the juice and heat it. Mix and stir the sugar and cornstarch and add gradually, cooking until the syrup is thick and clear.

Remove from the fire and add the lemon juice. Pour into the well baked tart shells... or into a pie shell, and sprinkle the remaining grated rind over the top. Cool and serve.

MOCK CHICKEN PIE 2 lbs veal rump 4 tablespoons shortening 2 onions, minced 1-2 cups chopped celery 2-2 cups water 1-2 teaspoons salt 3 tablespoons flour 2 hard-cooked eggs. Pastry Method: Wipe the veal and remove any fat or gristle. Cut in 1-inch cubes. Flour these lightly and brown well in the hot melted shortening. Add the onions, the celery and the water and cover closely. Cook gently until the meat and the vegetables are tender...

Method: Mix and sift the flour and salt. Cut in the shortening until it is in coarse pieces about the size of beans. Add the cold water, just enough to bind the ingredients together. Turn onto a lightly floured pastry cloth and roll out to fit the top of the baking dish. Lift it to the top of the pie, press tightly to the moistened edges of the dish and bake in a hot oven.

Relieves Coughing A mixture of the juice of two lemons, one tablespoon of granulated sugar, and one teaspoon of water, will usually relieve that irritating cough. Take one teaspoonful every half hour.

Old Potatoes When boiling old potatoes, if a teaspoonful of vinegar is added to the water, it will prevent the old potatoes, in spite of their age, from turning black.

How Can I?? (By ANNE ASHLEY) Q. How can I make a good wall paper cleaner? A. Mix 1 cup of flour and 1-2 cup of water to a smooth paste. Add 2 tablespoons of salt, 2 tablespoons of vinegar, 1 tablespoon of kerosene. Boil until thickens, stirring constantly. Allow to cool, then knead thoroughly. Use in the same way as the manufactured kind.

Q. How can I prepare linen articles that are to be marked with indelible ink? A. Before marking the linen articles, starch and iron them. By doing this the name can be written very small, and yet will be distinct.

Q. How can I make a good substitute for whipped cream? A. Slice one banana and add it to the white of an egg. Then beat it. The banana will dissolve. This makes a delicious substitute for whipped cream.

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The Housewife And Her Activities

Keep down or remove cooking odours by burning orange peel, coffee, or sugar in a pan. Cut the burnt sugar from the pan by adding some vinegar and cooking them together.

Dishes which have held fish should be washed in water with a generous quantity of dry mustard or washing soda added. Rinse well in clear, hot water.

Many homes, still structurally sound but not in demand due to excessive size, dated architecture, neighborhood changes, or other reasons, may be converted into income-producing apartments.

Through the expenditure of a reasonable amount for improvements, alterations and additions, old homes may be remodelled into several small apartment units and put on a revenue producing basis that may justify the outlay.

While extensive alterations necessary for remodeling a dwelling for apartment purposes do not always need the services of an architect, the scope and detail involved makes it desirable.

Damp basements, a frequently encountered flaw in construction, are often due to improper back filling. When a foundation is dug and later refilled, rubbish is sometimes used in the fill. Water running down the walls of the house collects in pools and seeps through pores or cracks in the walls and into the basement. The remedy is to refill the trench with clean carefully packed dirt.

In extreme cases it will be necessary to install a tile drain at the bottom of the trench to carry off the water.
