### MR. ANDERSON'S LETTER.

We print in another column the plain-spoken letter of Mr. John Anderson of Kensington. It is not only plain-spoken but somewhat pessimistic. Unfortunately the Scott Act is frequently and openly violated and this in face of the fact that at the last session of the Legislature both parties joined to affirm the principle of prohibition. Undoubtedly we have a right to look to the Government for an enforcement of all the laws that make for public order and for public morals.

We do not, however think that the cause of temperance and the interest therein are at so low an ebb as Mr. Anderson would have our readers believe. There has been and is a serious depression. The refusal of the Laurier Government to carry out the verdict recorded in the plebiscite, and the controversy that followed thereupon, have had a depressing effect. In that controversy the temperance party were divided. A strong minority favored punishing the Liberal Government, but the temperance Liberals would not join in this because there could be no hope of securing a prohibitory law from the Opposition if they were restored to power. This state of things prevented the prohibition question from being any considerable factor in the election just past. Hon. Hugh John Macdonald the other day gave his opinion that, "judging from this election the prohibition vote is a myth," and to a large extent this was true.

But it does not follow that we are going back to the license system throughout the Island. Any party that would dare to propose such a step would be swept out of existence at the polls. Our present duty is clearly to secure the election of as many members as we can who will stand by the principle of prohibition already affirmed, and who will aim to perfect and enforce the law that is to come into effect in June next. We fear that Mr. Anderson's letter may tend to spread the depression he so strongly feels, himself, and while we have no doubt of his sincerity and earnestness, we fear that many readers may detect, or think they detect between the lines of his letter a note of political bias that may make it unacceptable to them on the eve of an election.

If the temperance cause were at so low an ebb as Mr. Anderson has represented it to be it cannot be resurrected or revived by flinging into the maelstrom of party warfare. Unity rather than division is necessary to the progress of any moral reform. Temperance Liberals and temperance Conservatives cannot be united by mutual recrimination at election.

The GUARDIAN refuses to be drawn into a controversy at election times as to the relations between parties and prohibition. We regret the prevalence of extreme party spirit. We see no need for it in our provincial affairs. But so long as party spirit is as strong and universal as it is we must conclude that it is damaging rather than helpful to the temperance cause to become involved in party strife. If we have any word of guidance for our readers at such times it will be to use their best efforts to secure the nomination of reliable friends of prohibition by both parties, and afterwards to secure their election. The temperance candidate ought also to have ability, knowledge of public affairs and at least a sufficient measure of popularity to make his election something more than possible. Acting along these lines we may have that unity of purpose and action which will secure the best results. We have not much trust in either of the parties further than they are impelled by the strong moral sentiment of the electorate. But we would have strong faith in a Legislature made up of able, trustworthy temperance men such as the electors might choose if they would.
