CHICAGO, June 16.—Worse delays for harvest in the southwest with a recurrence of frost in the spring crop region gave a sharp upturn today to the price of wheat. The market closed strong at 1 3/4c to 2 1/4c advance. Other leading staples, too, all scored net gains, corn 1 1/4c to 2c and oats 3/4c to 1c. One of the best known authorities in the trade went on record with the opinion that the winter wheat harvest, taken as a whole, would be a week later than usual, and that meanwhile the damage done by hessian fly would become increasingly apparent.

WINNIPEG, June 16.—Owing to the cold weather over the Canadian West and the Dakotas and wet weather in the United States wheat belt the price of wheat went up today about 2c. Oats also scored an advance of 3/4c to 1c. The total inspections on Tuesday were 126 cars, as against 522 cars last year, and in sight today were only 60 cars.

TORONTO, June 16.—Crop damage reports and rumors of export business today resulted in an advance of about 2c in the price of wheat. Ontario No. 2 wheat is quoted at \$1.15 to \$1.17 outside, according to location. Oats, Canadian Western No. 2, 59c to 60c; Ontario No. 2 White 51c to 56c outside.

MONTREAL, June 16.—The tone of the local market for oats was stronger.
