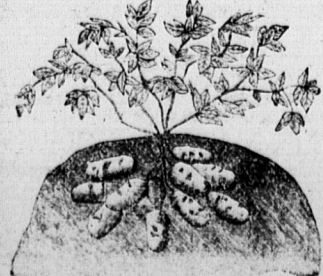

## MAN WHO RAN FIRST HORSE CAR IS DEAD.

BOSTON, March 27—Fifty-two years to a day from when he held the reins over the horses that drew the first horse car through Boston, Fred L. Hoole is dead at his home, No. 102 Prospect Street, Cambridge, at the age of seventy-five years.

## FAIL TO STOP SUGAR TRIAL.

NEW YORK, March 25—Judge Hand in the criminal branch of the United States District Court today denied the motions made by the defence in the trial of the directors of the Sugar Trust to instruct the jury to return a verdict of not guilty. The decision is looked on as an initial victory for the prosecution. In refusing to grant the motions Judge Hand contended it has been shown that the defendants were guilty of conspiring in restraint of trade. The defence then began the introduction of testimony.

## DAVID RUSSELL CLAIMS EVIDENCE WAS PRIVILEGED.

MONTREAL, March 26—Interesting arguments as to the immunity of a witness under British laws were heard in the practice court today when hearing of an inscription entered by David Russell against a \$50,000 damage action taken against him by J. W. McNamara, of the Pinkerton Detective Agency, was proceeded with. The case arises from the action taken some time ago by Mr. Russell against the Pinkertons for alleged conspiracy against him to ruin his character and to have him placed in an asylum. An action which was dismissed by Mr. Justice Archer after a lengthy hearing.

J. W. McNamara takes exception to statements alleged to have been made by David Russell concerning him prior to and during the trial and is suing Mr. Russell for \$50,000. Mr. Russell is seeking the dismissal of the suit through an injunction. For Mr. Russell, George Campbell today made exhaustive references to jurisprudence to show that regarding Mr. Russell's evidence at the trial all such testimony was absolutely privileged.

The statements made before the trial and given publication in a number of newspapers throughout the country cannot give rise to a damage action, pleads Mr. Russell, as they were not defamatory or libellous in their character, and treated of a matter of public interest; and were only given out to contradict certain rumors concerning Mr. Russell to the effect that he was of unsound mind.

## AMERICAN OPERATORS AND COAL MINERS STILL DISAGREE.

CLEVELAND, O., March 26—Ability to agree today again marked the attempts of the bituminous coal miners and operators to fix a two year wage and working agreement to take effect April 1 in Western Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. When the conference adjourned until tomorrow, each side stood where it was a week ago, the miners declaring that unless they secured a ten per cent increase in pay and shorter working hours, they would not work after next Sunday midnight, when their present state expires, and the operators asserting they would not grant the demands.

## THE RELIGIOUS TEST CUT OUT FROM QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY.

OTTAWA, March 26—The Queen's university bill was amended in the senate committee today along the lines suggested by the Hebrews of Canada. The amendment cuts out the religious test and makes it one of character. It reads— "The trustees shall satisfy themselves of the Christian character of those appointed to the staff." The church and university authorities consented to the change.

## \$50,000 TO OLD EMPLOYEES.

PHILADELPHIA, March 26—Isaac Schlechter has distributed \$50,000 among fifty of his old employees in sums of from \$500 to \$2,000. Four employees have seen forty years' service.
