### THE CENTURY PROBLEM.

We have received from the publishers, Messrs. Imrie, Graham & Co. of Toronto, what is called The Twentieth Century Catechism, of which the author is Rev. John Kay, Presbyterian minister of Deer Park Church, Toronto. An accompanying circular advertising the Catechism is illustrated by the coarse and familiar picture of a big, open mouthed and aggressive man autocratically dictating his views to a modest little man. "This is the twentieth century and don't you forget it!" screams the big fellow. It very well represents the attitude which Rev. Mr. Kay assumes toward his readers. We read in Morgan's Men and Women of the Time that Mr. Kay came to this country from Scotland on account of ill-health. After reading his Catechism we fear he is not yet recovered, and would recommend that he move on further. He need have no fears as to the welfare of the people he would leave behind. Scotland has flourished greatly since he left and Toronto can dispense with a preacher who parodies the catechism of his church in order to teach a mathematical absurdity, which even his publishers do not for a moment believe. The publishers in a note to THE GUARDIAN say:

"Kindly let us have a short, racy, humorous notice of this little book. It is the last chance for a little humor ere the century closes." Note the last words. The Reverend author of the misleading Catechism ought to have begun at Jerusalem and converted, or rather perverted them to a community in which common sense prevails. It takes just 1900 cents to make nineteen dollars, and 1900 full years go to complete nineteen centuries. No amount of dogmatism or catechism, sophistry or mental de-Kay can convince the world to the contrary. We frankly do not think the Catechism is worth the dime which is the price named for it.

### THE EAST QUEENS RECOUNT.

Notwithstanding a small apparent majority for Mr. Martin in the first reports of the voting in East Queen's the result of the recount before Judge Macdonald, which was concluded yesterday, is to award the seat to Hon. D. A. McKinnon. Certain marks on the back of nearly or quite one half of the ballots at Murray Harbor poll led the Judge to reject them. Report has it that the marks were made by the deputy returning officer numbering the ballots in pencil, and that he afterwards on discovering his mistake, erased the marks as far as possible, though on many of the ballots the indentation remained showing the figures as if made by a style. The matter may yet come before the higher courts on appeal, but on this point THE GUARDIAN is without any information.
