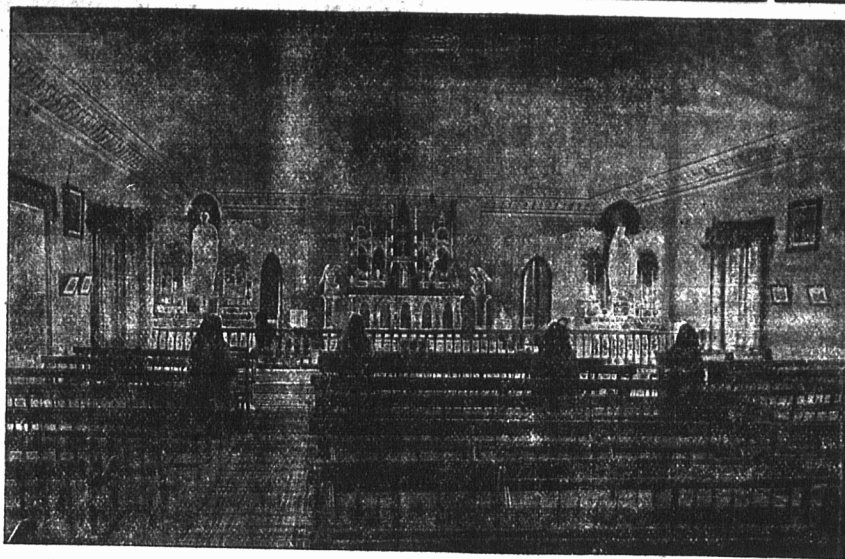

Notre Dame Convent was crowded to its capacity, and the teachers' strong hands taxed in attending to the numbers of children who flocked to their classes. Yet all the children came from homes in the east end of the city; those of the west were unprovided for.

The Bishop of Charlottetown, the Right Reverend Dr. McIntyre ever zealous for the welfare of the little ones of his flock took this matter into consideration and endeavored to procure a house in a convenient neighborhood, where the nuns could open a school. His Lordship therefore purchased a lot of Pownal Street whereon stood three very dilapidated houses, one of which might be made habitable. After some repairs they were in but the cottage was small and close and not in any means suitable. They believed that a blessing would rest on the labors and Providence soon came to their aid.

Long ago, in the year 1838 the Catholic People of St. Andrew's, Naufrage, Franco Three Rivers, Fortune and East Point united to build a Chapel at St. Andrew's. This Chapel was sixty feet long by thirty six wide and was known as St. Andrew's Chapel. But as time advanced and the population increased it was found that the Chapel was entirely too small and in the year 1864 its congregation, preferring comfort to sentiment, had built a more commodious place of worship. They then made Bishop McIntyre a present of the old church, and with this gift they coupled the offer of assistance should they wish to transport it to Charlottetown. Their offer was accepted, and towards the end of January, 1864, the Rev. Dr. McDonald, so well known and loved in Charlottetown as "Father Dan," went to St. Andrews to superintend the detaching of the church from its foundations, and its preparation for a long and dangerous journey. Having started the enterprise he returned to town, leaving the charge of the work to the parish priest, Rev. Pius McPherson.

For more than a month the good people of St. Andrews worked under the direction of their pastor, and then, all being ready, they awaited the coming of a severe frost to prepare the ice for the heavy load in store for it. The 1st of March was the date chosen for moving the church, and on that day all the farmers of St. Andrews and the neighboring parishes assembled, bringing with them over 100 horses, which were to be harnessed to the two heavy iron runners that had been made for the church. Their efforts were for the time frustrated by the state of the soil, which is very swampy in that district. Nothing daunted they set themselves to prepare a road, and this kept them busy until evening. The next day just as they were starting, a blinding fall of snow put an end to the project for that day, and caused the whole scheme to be delayed until the following week.
