Cutlets a la Monte.

Take half dozen small neck cutlets of lamb and stew until thoroughly done in good stock with a goodly supply of soup vegetables. Take them out and weight them down with a board until quite cold. Brush over with glaze and ornament on one side with pretty colored vegetables cut into thin strips and arranged to form a lattice pattern. Make a salad of the cold boiled vegetables with peas to predominate, and heap it in a dish. Lay the cutlets around the edge with the ornamented side up and garnish the top with chopped aspic jelly.
