**CHTOWN FARMERS' MARKET**

The market was fairly well supplied yesterday.

Potatoes have dropped to 40 cts per bushel with the future outlook in the buyers' favor. The excitement which prevailed last week in the potato market, causing prices to advance to a rather risky pitch for buyers to hold to without loss, has subsided.

Oats with the exception of clover seed are dull. 34 cts per bush for black and 33 for white were the buyers' prices yesterday.

Some dressed hogs are still offering and prices remain about the same as last week's quotations viz 6 cts per lb for best lots, with lower figures for light and heavy grades. Live hogs are worth 4 1/2 cts per lb for light weight and lower prices for coarse grades.

Eggs are holding at 12c per dozen but the tendency is downward.

Butter from market baskets is a fraction lower bringing 22 to 23 cts per lb.

Hay brought from 65 to 70 cts per 100 lbs.

Price paid for fowl is from 8 1/2 to 9 cts per lb.

**HORSE NOTES.**

**Historic Cape Cod.**

A movement is on foot to mark the historic spots in which the old town of Barnstable, on Cape Cod, abounds. It has been stated that this town contains fully as much of historic interest as Plymouth, and there are many unmarked localities that have been identified with stirring events in the early days of the colonies. The first courthouse built in the county still stands at the head of Rendezvous Lane, where the volunteers of the Revolution first assembled, although the building has been transformed into a church. In front of it is the little triangle where the liberty pole stood and where the troops were drilled. In this courthouse was sounded the first note of revolt against British rule, and it is proposed to place inscribed tablets on these spots and others equally interesting to commemorate and preserve the traditions connected with them.
