MILITIA OUT IN NEW YORK.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) NEW YORK, Feb. 6.-The five great East River bridges connecting Manhattan and Long Island are being guarded by naval militia, equipped as infantrymen. Fire naval tugs are patrolling the river. Each bridge is being guarded by 100 militiamen. At Hell Gate 100 men are also stationed. Governor Whitman has ordered the general mobilization of the National Guard of the State of New York. The mobilization is for the purpose of protecting public works.
