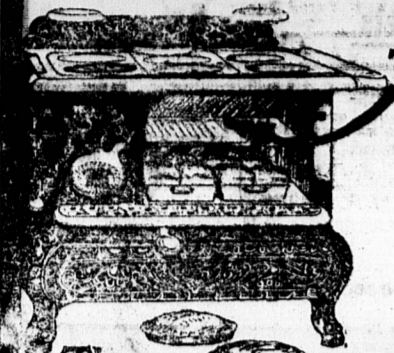

There were eighteen hundred bags of oats, two hundred cases of eggs, fifty dressed hogs, five horses and two hundred boxes of apples among the shipments by the Express, from Summerside yesterday.
