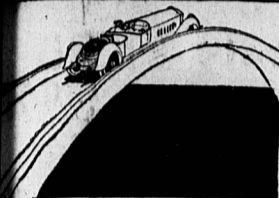

"SOLDIERS SETTLEMENT.—One swallow does not make a summer, nor one black sheep does not condemn the flock. In like manner, though one soldier fails to make good, it does not follow that the great majority fail. Ninety-five per cent of the soldiers, settled on the land, are making good. The exception was a case of a soldier settled by the Board, in Lot 37. He failed to make good and was evicted by the Settlement Board a short time ago. The stock and implements given him, were sold by auction. What remained, and the farm sold to Mr. John Jay, Clarkstown, Lot 37, at a price equal to what the soldier was to pay. The Settlement Board had, the week previous to closing the sale, this farm surveyed, by Mr. John A. Macdonald, Surveyor, Hermanville, and turned over to Mr. Jay, the purchaser.

STRAIGHT LIBERAL DEFEAT. ED IN KAMOURASKA

QUEBEC, Oct. 20.—Returns received from the provincial elections held in Kamouraska and St. Maurice today, indicated late tonight that while N. Morin, Independent Liberal, defeated J. Dupuis, N. P., the choice of the Liberal convention in Kamouraska, by a majority of 245, the issue in St. Maurice County between J. S. Gullmette, Liberal, and Nestor Ricard, N. P., Independent Liberal was still in doubt.

The last report from St. Maurice stated that both candidates were claiming victory. Gullmette by a majority of 12 votes and Ricard by a majority of 29.

NAVY LEAGUE PENSIONS

One hundred dollars per month for a widow with four children, or \$20 per month for each member of the family, is the aim of the Navy League of Canada in pensioning the widows and orphans of Canadian mercantile sailors who lost their lives on active service during the war. The League during Trafalgar Sailors Week, Oct. 18 to 23 propose to raise \$760,000 for the work in general, of which \$144,000 will be used as an endowment for pensions. The income from this endowment along with funds already in hand will be sufficient to meet the national situation. The Navy League of Canada in appealing to the public for funds

feels that no widow should be hungry or any child go through life without a proper education because the father paid the supreme sacrifice on active service. Many of the men on the merchant ships carried food, munitions, troops and general supplies, were torpedoed at sea and went down as British seamen always have done—standing aside, "Women and Children first."

The plan as decided upon by the executive is to grant a pension to each widow and family according to requirements and carry on the relief work already commenced upon a large and permanent scale. Each child who lost his or her daddy during the war will be

granted a pension adequate to every necessary expense for a good education and therefore the country at large through the medium of the Navy League will be fathering all these children, giving them home, education, until they are able to support themselves and get a proper start in life.

Through this endowment the mother will be able to remain at home, take care of her children and make a home what it ought to be. The League considers that every woman with children should be in the home, sufficiently supported with finances, so that she can bring her children up properly and not be forced to leave them

alone all day to play on the streets, while she works, taking the place of both father and mother. Bert W. Wemp, Navy League of Canada, 34 King St., West, Toronto.
