### THE WINTER SERVICE.

It is understood that an important appointment has been made by the Dominion Government in connection with the winter steamers. R. Vernon Longworth, late of the Bank of Nova Scotia, has been named to have charge of the Marine Wharf and the oversight of the men engaged in loading and discharging the winter steamers in port, here and at Georgetown. This, we suppose carries with it the receiving and distributing of freight, the care of perishable freight, the issuing of bills of lading, quoting rates to shippers and various other miscellaneous duties. It seems highly desirable that these important duties should be entrusted to some one who has had the requisite training and experience in shipping business.

This knowledge and experience in shipping matters could hardly have fallen to the lot of Mr. Longworth who has been from early youth engaged in banking. The Guardian would be glad to chronicle the appointment of Mr. Longworth to any good position for which he has the requisite knowledge and fitness, but in this case we do not think the choice is one which would have been made had the leading shippers of the port and Province been consulted. The winter steamer service is of such great importance to the entire Island that the Government will necessarily be held to strict account for its efficiency and the appointment in this case made is one upon which very much must depend. It would seem to have been a case in which those responsible for the choice should have taken our shippers fully into their confidence in a way that appears not to have been done in this instance.

A drop in the thermometer and a light fall of snow reminds every one that our delightful autumn season is near its close if not altogether past. Of course there is the usual rush to get the storm doors and sashes in place, that duty having been as usual postponed a little too long.

There is really more shipping traffic past the Soo or through the Detroit River than in the lower St. Lawrence, the former being almost free from disasters while in the latter they multiply painfully. Carelessness of pilots or captains or both seems to be indicated in the Quebec channel, which is quite as well lighted and guarded, and certainly not more difficult than the more thronged waterways farther inland.

All the excellent ministerial journals tell of the fine abilities and high character of Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, now Postmaster General. But Mr. Aylesworth announces himself as opposed to the pension system as applied to ex Ministers and says he will labor to have it repealed. This is really very shocking in view of the fact that Sir Wilfrid Laurier, his leader and Mr. Aylesworth's other colleagues in the Cabinet are responsible for and wholly committed to these pensions. Lord Melbourne once told his Cabinet colleagues, "It does not matter what you say, gentlemen, but you must all say the same thing." In pledging his efforts to repeal the pension grab Mr. Aylesworth comes perilously near to committing the crime for which J. Israel Tarte was thrown out of the Cabinet.

### RUSSIA TASTING FREEDOM.

Judging from recent deliveries of some Russian newspapers the Muscovite editors and writers are making full use of the newly conceded freedom of the press. Two new journals in St. Petersburg, the Novaya Zhizn (New Life) and the Nashlo (Beginning) are indeed very outspoken. Maxim Gorky, one of some forty of the most brilliant and forcible writers employed on these journals; sets down boldly that the revolution of October which broke down the autocracy is but the first step in the evolution of freedom in Russia. The next step will be the levelling of all social ranks.

Gorky tells that all former despotic governments in Europe were overthrown by the people under the leadership of the middle classes, with the result of forming constitutional monarchies which are "paradises for the bourgeoisie but economic hells for the workmen." Russia owes its revolution to an organized army of workmen who are able to oppose the Government with a weapon which has paralysed the nation's heart. He says the credit for what has been accomplished is due to the noble minded body of students, who for years vainly tried to arouse the peasantry, but finally turned back to the cities and in the shops and factories found the men who brought about the October revolution. He aims at a socialistic republic.

The middle classes, professional men, merchants and employers, the Zemstvos as he calls them, and other constitutionalists are denounced in scathing terms by Gorky. "While the workmen's army marched to battle," he says, "they hung in the rear, but when the army returned after destroying the outer bulwarks of the autocracy, they were at the head, singing songs of triumph." It was clearly the workmen, incited and led by the students who brought the autocracy to terms. The workers are now conscious of their power and are not prepared to stop just where the more cautious middle classes might desire to stop. Other forward steps will be attempted or taken and what the end may be we can only conjecture. For with a free press and the right of free assembly and free speech, the agitators are no longer required to take their lives in their hands in making their appeal to the masses.
