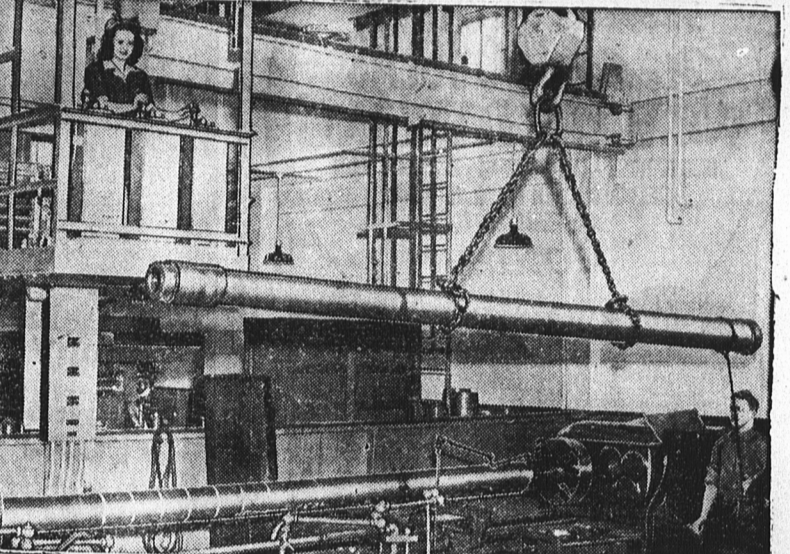
New Nazi Plane Has Air-Cooled Engine

NEW YORK, July 23—(AP)—Two events of recent weeks have revived the old arguments of the air-cooled radial engine Vs the liquid-cooled, in-line engine for combat planes—The Nazis switch to an air-cooled engine in their latest-type Focke-Wulf 190 fighter, and the death over the English Channel last week of Wing Comdr. Brendan (Paddy) Finucane of the Royal Air Force, the Aerian, at a horrificative British aviation journal, reports that the appearance of the Focke-Wulf 190H, with a BMW 801 engine is likely to produce "a great deal of trouble" for the R. A. F.

There are conflicting reports on this Nazi development, but both appear to agree on one point, that unless Britain has new equipment in operation of which she has given no detail so far, the German fighter surpasses in speed and manoeuvrability, if not in firepower, any single-engined fighter plane now based in Britain.

Possibly the balance has been readjusted, or will be shortly, by new R.A.F. types such as the Hawker Typhoon and the twin-engined Westland Whirlwind or the newly-improved Spitfire. Meanwhile the FW 190H is given a 20 to 25 mi-an-hour edge over the present "Spit" and Hurricanes.

There is no indication anywhere that the Germans are running shy either of skilled manpower or of essential materials. The BMW 801 engine itself is put together with exceptional attention to detail—more so, in some respects, than American manufacturers would care to pay or consider worthwhile—and shows excellent workmanship.



THERE'S NO 'FOR MEN ONLY' SIGN IN WAR INDUSTRY

As more women enlist in war industry, more jobs hitherto done only by men are filled by women work-ers. Latest estimate reports more than 125,000 women now engaged in industrial war work. The pretty lathe operator in the UPPER photo is "testing the cut" to make sure the machine is in shape as she performs one of the 50 operations required to turn a steel forging into a 2,000-pound 3 1/2 inch gun barrel. The girl handling the man-size task in the LOWER picture is one of the five female crane operators in one of the Dominion's largest gun plants, turning out heavy anti-aircraft artillery on behalf of the Department of Munitions and Supply.
