Rev H. R. Bell will preach in the Fredericton Hall on Sunday the twenty-sixth instant at three o'clock in the afternoon and at seven in the evening.

The game of baseball to have taken place last evening between the Teddy Bears and Orlebars was postponed owing to the unfavorable condition of the weather.

The Northumberland arrived in this city at eight-thirty last evening. She brought over three cars freight; fifteen passengers and a steam launch for Mr Larner.

Rev Ewen McDougall will preach at Lot 48 on Sabbath twenty-sixth inst. Rev D. McLean will preach at Nine Mile Creek on Tuesday the twenty-eighth inst instead of Thursday as previously announced.

During the month of May T. A. Peters of the Fruit Division, Ottawa, held series of horticultural meetings throughout the Province, in which he advocated the Lime-sulphur Spray for use while the trees were still dormant. He gave the formula for making it up and in some instances made up the mixture and sprayed the trees. The formula which he gave for winter spraying would not do for summer spraying, as it would burn the leaves and it is not advisable for any person to try to make up this mixture for themselves. If it is intended to use Lime-sulphur for summer spraying the Commercial Lime-sulphur Formula should be used and directions followed carefully. From the reports it would seem that the Commercial Lime-sulphur is better than the Bourdeau mixture, but until further experience with it, it might be well to stick to the Bourdeau.

The energetic spirit which prompted two young men, citizens of Charlottetown, to walk from their homes to Mt Stewart yesterday, is deserving of emulation by others of the sports at least in so far as a test for physical endurance is concerned. The pair started at 10.20 a. m. and arrived at 2.30 p. m. having had nothing to eat since six o'clock of the previous evening. On their arrival at Mt Stewart they found they were not entirely unexpected, their approach having been bulletined in different stages by some admirers of the feat accomplished by the pedestrians. True to the program laid out by the walkers they took the afternoon train for this city from Mt Stewart and arrived here at five thirty, not by any means exhausted, but with a trifling knowing of the digestive organs that forecasted a rapid and wholesale disappearance of food at supper time in at least two homes in this city. It has not been ascertained whether or not the tramp will be repeated.
