Walnut Hall Farms sale of yearlings was well attended but the average prices for colts and fillies raced at that famous nursery of speed did not equal that of previous years.

Ben White, who has as his assistant Will Caton, developer of two world's champions and former reinsman for the late Czar of Russia, is training two dozen yearlings at his stable Lexington track, Kentucky. It will be remembered that Ben White wrote to the harness horse papers last June condemning the training of yearlings, stating that he was broken down in the process and that they should only be partly developed as two-year-olds then they could be raced sound as three-year-olds.

The world's fastest trotting mare, Ralinda, 1:56 3-4 will not start again. She has been retired by her owner, Gibson White, a son of Ben White, and is now enjoying freedom in a large grass field at the Hanover Shire Farm, Hanover, Pa. Late she will be bred to one of the stallions there.

New records were few at the Lexington, Kentucky, meeting this year. Most of the year's champions were made there. Greyhound setting a world's record of 1:55 1-4. Ralinda trotting in 1:56 3-4 to come the world's fastest trotting mare. Billy Direct pacing in 1:55 to crown himself as the greatest pacer ever, and Her Lazvish pacing in 1:53 3-4 to become the world's champion pacer while she was developing by Joe and Willie.

Many of those who took part at that time as drivers have passed on and the horses' names are among the forgotten to most of our readers. (By Sid Feder, Associated Press Sports Writer) CINCINNATI, Oct. 6 (AP)—Only two games away from humiliating erasure from the 1939 World Series, and faced with the prospect of meeting the third member of New York Yankees dreaded "sore arm" pitching squad, Cincinnati Reds came home today stubbornly refusing to admit they were whipped yet.

And the Rhineland fans agreed with them, despite a Yankee display of hitting dynamite at a lengthy batting drill in Crosley Field and the news that Lefty Gomez, injured side and all, would be the world champions' choice to do the hurling chores in tomorrow's third game against the Reds' freshman find, Junior Thompson.

Several thousand wide-eyed fans turned up at the railroad station as the Reds' special train pulled in from New York, where the National League champions dropped the first two games of the series. They cheered their heroes on with such figurative back-slapping roars as "you're home now boys; let's go," and "we'll show 'em up here."

Hundreds more of the faithful were jammed on the sidewalks all around the hotel that housed baseball headquarters, and they added their greetings to those of the horde at the station.

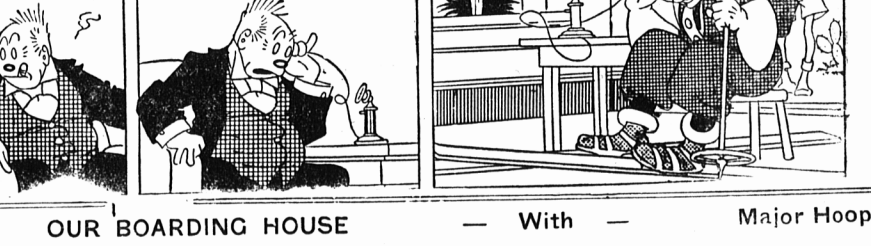

C. C. F. ALARMED OTTAWA, Oct. 6 (CP)—A protest from the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation against the Government's censorship of political broadcasts was made public tonight by Prime Minister Mackenzie King in the release of a letter from M. J. Coldwell, M. P., National Chairman of the C. C. F., and the Prime Minister's reply to Mr. Coldwell. The letters disclosed the alarm of C. C. F. leaders at the "sweeping character" of the general censorship regulations and at certain sections of the defence of Canada regulations which are termed "totalitarian in character" and unwarranted in Canada.
