TROUBLE AMONG FISHERMEN.

ST. JOHN, Sept. 20.—A war which gives promise of culminating in a strike, is now brewing among the sardine fishermen of St John and of Charlotte counties. A reduction in the price of sardines from \$8 to \$6 per hoghead made by the canners is the cause of the trouble.

Fishermen from both counties were in the city yesterday and an animated meeting was held on the West Side at which it was decided to sell no sardines to canneries at less than \$6 per hoghead.

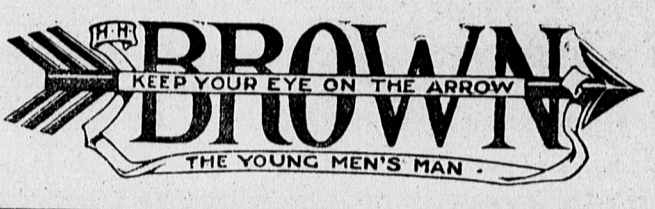
