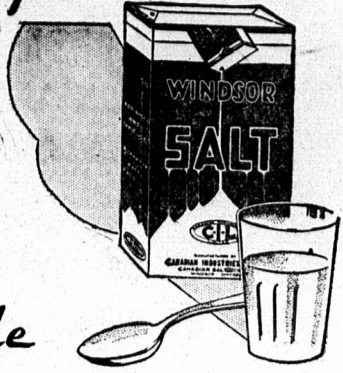

Flowers In A Woman's Life

VANCOUVER, B. C., April 21—(By The Canadian Press)—Red flowers to represent "the strength and character of man," and white flowers to symbolize the "frailties of woman," were always used at marriage festivals in Japan, Mrs. Savell Grigsby, who lived many years in the Orient, said in a lecture at the Art Gallery here, sponsored by the Handicrafts Guild.

The tulip was a favorite flower at such ceremonies, as was the rose for its purity and sweetness, and the Crysanthemum for its exquisite beauty; but whatever flowers were used, those representing men were turned to the right and those for the women, to the left.

Flower arrangement as an art had come to Japan in the sixteenth century, and was of purely Buddhist origin, Mrs. Grigsby said. The heaven, earth and man symbol was the oldest, and formed the basic principle in all flower arrangement. It was known as "Life out of Death" and was used frequently for the funeral of an older man.

To understand fully the symbols, thought and teaching in flower arrangement, a life-time study was required, and Mrs. Grigsby referred to the teacher under whom she herself had studied, a man of seventy who had devoted his entire life to the subject and who, in many ways, had come to resemble the medium in which he worked.

Japanese art can not be detached from Japanese life as a whole, said Mrs. Grigsby. The first painters were Buddhist priests, and their subjects of a devout nature. The speaker traced the change from painting to black and white prints and from these to prints colored by hand, and so down to the most colorful prints of the present day.

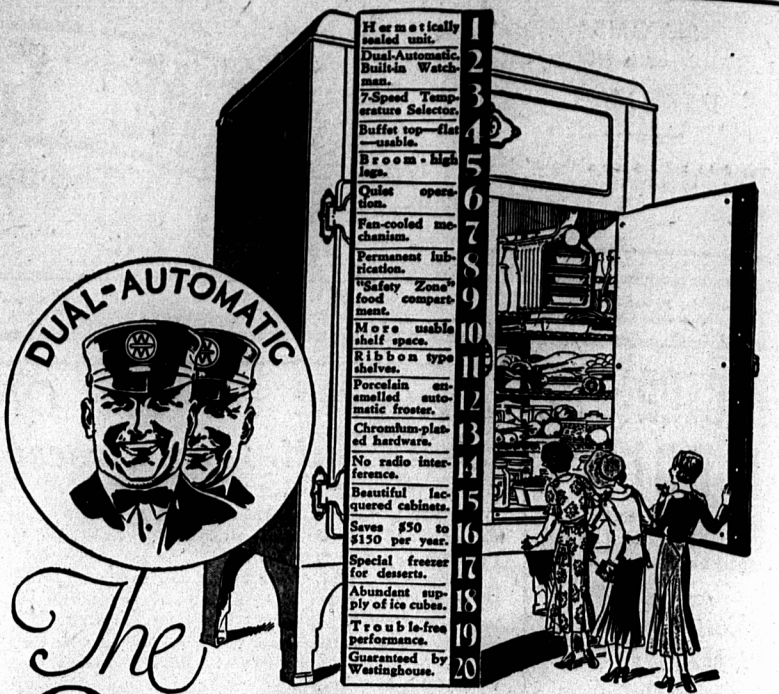
