THE NEW YORK ELECTION.

The corporation of the city of New York is noted for a larger annual expenditure than any similar body on the face of the earth. It regularly collects and spends from 98 to 100 millions of dollars per annum, while the bond issues, or in other words money borrowed, run the expenditure up to nearly 150 millions yearly. The much more populous city of London expends about 60 millions yearly, or say one half what it costs to govern New York. Greater New York under its charter is divided into five boroughs, namely, Manhattan, Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens and Richmond. The legislative power, is vested in a Municipal Assembly of two houses the Council of 25 members, holding office for four years, with salaries of \$1500 each and the Board of Aldermen, holding office for two years with salaries of \$1,000 each. The Mayor is elected for four years by the entire city, is ineligible for re-election, and has a salary of \$15,000 yearly. The President of the Council, also elected by the entire city for four years, has a salary of \$5,000.

The members of the Municipal Council constitute the local boards for the government of their respective boroughs, and each of these boards has a President with a salary of \$3,000 to \$5,000 with highly paid secretaries, stenographers and clerks in the pay of the board. The number of civic employees is necessarily large, but has been enormously increased under Tammany rule and they now number about 50,000, with wages approximately \$50,000,000, of which \$8,000,000 represents the additions made since Croker obtained control in 1897.

Richard Croker was born in Ireland and came to New York with his parents when two years of age and was educated in the public schools there. He was Alderman in 1868-70 and in 1883; Coroner from 1873 to 1876; Fire Commissioner in 1883 and Chamberlain from 1889 to the end of 1890. Early in his career he became a member of Tammany Hall, and was a strong opponent of the notorious Tweed Ring. Step by step he improved his position in Tammany, but without exciting suspicion of his ambition, till in 1897 he stepped boldly to the front and his nominee, Van Wyck, was elected the first Mayor of Greater New York. Since then Croker has lived mainly in England, on the estate he bought at Wantage. There he lives the life of an English squire, racing his horses on the English tracks while his sons live the life of young Englishmen of the moneyed class.

While Croker has held no civic office during the past four years he has, as the Boss of Tammany directed the city government and shared largely in the profits of corrupt contracts. He has never disguised but rather openly professed that he is in politics for what he can make out of it. As a result the past four years has been one prolonged carnival of corruption, vice and crime, an orgie of

loot and black mail. [Mark Twain in a public meeting the other day averred that "Tammany could give pointers to Sodomy and Gomorrah". The liquor saloons, the gambling dens, the dives and brothels, have been "protected" by the police wherever they would pay, while every form of persecution has been brought to bear upon those who sought to promote reform or to bring the real criminals to justice. Burglary and robbery were committed at, until in six months 14,168 robberies were committed, in which \$1,233,517 was plundered from the victims.

It was not surprising that with such facts before them a large majority of the decent newspapers were in the late contest arrayed on the side of reform, while in nearly every Protestant church during the campaign, and especially on Sunday last the pulpits rang with denunciations of the corrupt civic government.

Through the kindness of Mr. James of the Telegraph Company, who made inquiries at 9.30 o'clock last evening, THE GUARDIAN was informed that only partial returns had been then received, but they indicated the probable election of Mr. Low as Mayor. Still later advices give assurance that he has been elected.
