LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Feb. 12—(CP)—The Dominion Livestock Branch reported today there were 38 cattle, 1 lamb, 285 hogs and 24 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets.

There were two carloads of good quality steers which were sold at \$9.15 to \$9.50. A few common butcher cows made \$4.25 to \$4.50. Veal calves ranged from \$9 to \$12 according to weight and quality. Drinkers \$6 to \$8.50 and grassers \$4.50 to \$5.

Hogs were unchanged at \$11.50 for dressed, \$8.50 to \$8.60 for B-1 alive fed and watered and up to \$8.75 off trucks delivered. Grade "A" drew \$1 per hog premium with discount on off grades. S-ws were \$5.50 to \$6.50.

On Maritime markets Moncton hogs sold at \$11.10 for B-1 dressed rail grade. Sows rail grade were \$7.40 for no. 1 up to 270 lbs. and \$7.40 for no. 2 over 270 lbs. No. 2 sows all weights were \$5.40. Choice steers were \$8.75 good \$8.25, medium \$7, fair \$6 and common \$4.75.

Choice heifers were \$7.75 good \$7.25, medium \$6.50, fair \$5.75 and common \$4.50. Good cows were \$5.50, medium \$4.75, fair \$4. Canners were \$2 to \$2.25 and cutters up to \$3.25. Boning bulls sold from \$3.25 to \$3.75 and butcher bulls up to \$5.25. Veal calves sold up to \$8.50 and grassers up to \$4.50.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, Feb. 12—(CP)—The market tone improved in the final hour today on the Toronto exchange and prices showed a margin of changes on the up side for all four groups. Volume was 184,000 shares.

Imperial Oil formed 3-8 and Ford added 1-4. Moderate gainers were Bell Telephone, Building Products and Dominion Bridge.

Moderate gains showed for Atnor, Central Patricia, Carbo, East Mairiac, Kerr-Addison, McKenzie, McWaters, Perron, Preston, Sigma, Upper Canada and Wright-Hargreaves while soft tone persisted for Pioneer and Teck Hughes. Noranda closed 1-4 down and senior base metals issues held unchanged.

The close was up fractions to a cent or two for Home Oil, Osagy and Edmonton, Davies and Prairie Royalties.
