Cross group hospital plan, announced that the total of participating hospitals in the three provinces had risen to 40 with completion of a contract with the Annapolis General Hospital and the intention of establishing the Annapolis General Hospital as a provincial hospital. The Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island ladies hospital aid association decided to disband so its auxiliaries might divide into provincial groups and function regionally under the Maritime Hospital Aids Association.

George Bugbee, executive secretary of the American Hospital Association, said in an address tonight that in the future citizens of Canada and the United States will "reasonably demand that hospital and medical care of high grade be readily available to every citizen irrespective of ability to pay whether the patient lives in a city or on a farm."

The only worry of hospital authorities was that the desire of the average citizen may lead him to accept methods for the distribution of hospital and medical care which, if hastily determined, may cause a reduction in the quality of such care.

The American Hospital Association had recommended government assistance in hospital care for the indigent. We also believe that the government should assist in hospital construction in those areas where local resources have not permitted adequate hospital provision.

Mr. Bugbee complimented the "remarkable growth" of the Blue 300 hospitals showed that 57 had been forced to close 1,490 beds.

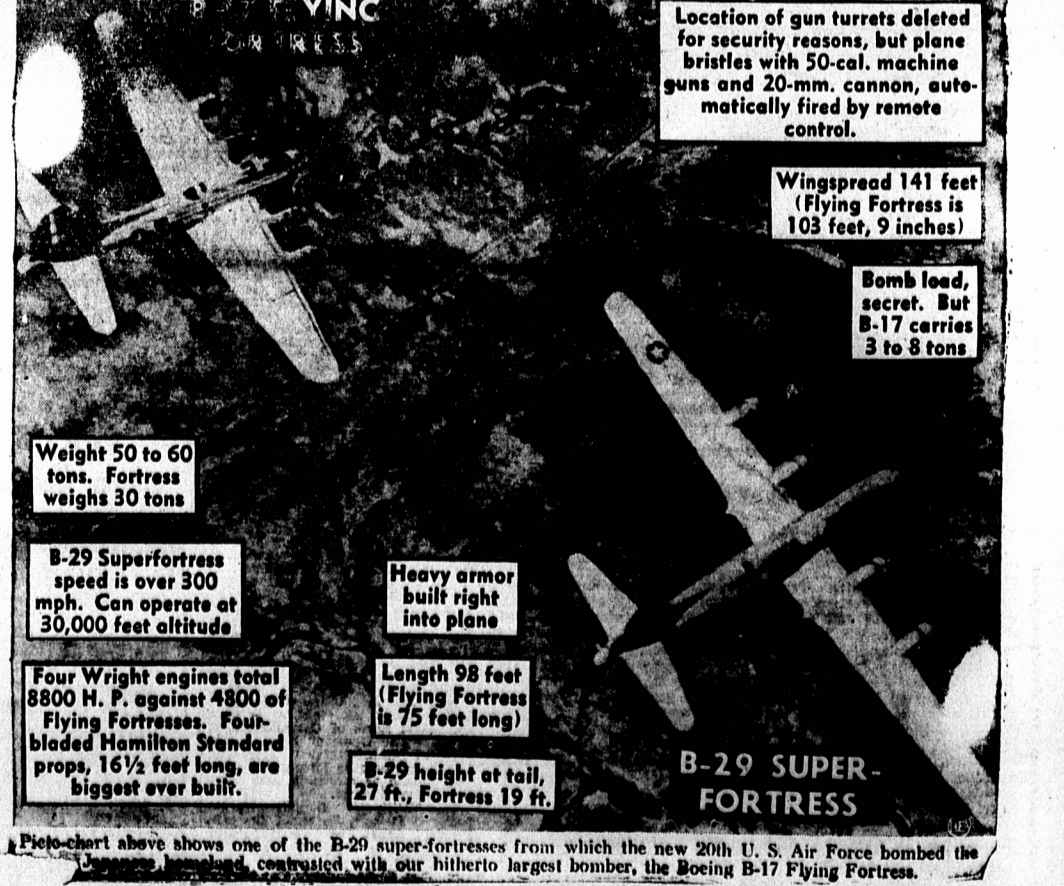
## Finland Peace Cabinet Formed?

## Great B-29 Superbomber and Its "Little" Sister, Flying Fortress



**Location of gun turrets deleted for security reasons, but plane bristles with 50-cal. machine guns and 20-mm. cannon, automatically fired by remote control.**

**Wingspread 141 feet (Flying Fortress is 103 feet, 9 inches)**

**Bomb load, secret. But B-17 carries 3 to 8 tons**

**Weight 50 to 60 tons. Fortress weighs 30 tons**

**B-29 Superfortress speed is over 300 mph. Can operate at 30,000 feet altitude**
