Southern Element Denounce President

FOR RECEIVING NEGROES

Prominent Men Denounce the Idea And Many Assert They Will not Again Visit White House.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—Southern senators and representatives held little indignation meeting Sunday at the capitol. The subject under discussion was the presence of several negro men and women at the White House reception in honor of congress and the judicial.

It was ascertained that the negro guests were John C. Daney, Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, and his wife and daughter, who accompanied him; Judson Lyons, Registrar of the Treasury, and six or eight other negroes, men and women, whose names are not known.

The colored guests had a rather lonesome time of it at the reception. After they had shaken hands with the President and had passed into the east room they stood for some time in one corner of the apartment talking among themselves, but not mingling with the white guests.

Several senators and congressmen from the Southern States declared that they would never visit the White House again, either socially or on business.

The indignant Southern senators and Congressmen declared that President Roosevelt had sought to force the social equality of the races by inviting negroes to last night's reception and that he offered them a personal insult.

It was stated, and the fact seems to be established, that only in rare instances in the past has a negro man attended a White House reception, altho invited to do so, and that probably no negro woman has even been there.

WHY ENGLISH ARE TAKEN BY YANKEES.

Analysis of Motives Proves the Result.

ARE FROM ENVIROMENT

The Reason Why Englishmen marry American Women is A Very Simple One.

LONDON, Feb. 3.—Some American writer has been pointing out through the medium of the newspaper correspondent columns that something between seventy and eighty English nobles and foreign princes and gentlemen of title have married American women of greater or less fortunes.

"It is," the writer says, "becoming almost impossible for a foreign Ambassador successfully to perform his duties at New York unless, like the Count von Sernberg, who is to represent Germany, or Sir Michcz' Henry Herbert, we shall have first, as a precautionary measure, forestalled criticism by marrying in Fifth Avenue, The Yankee believes as the very heart of him that every Englishman would like to marry an American girl, and that only those don't who can't."

"Yet the explanation of the phenomenon lies not wholly in the greater attractiveness of English sons. Indeed, the manners of the men are by no means so polished in the old country as in the new. The reason why Englishmen marry American women while American men do not so often marry English women, is in the main, a very simple one.

"But American girls certainly are attracted by the dazzling, if illusory, opportunities for social distinction which are offered by a land where aristocracy is based upon birth rather than upon fluctuations of wealth. It is, moreover, extraordinary that American ladies of acknowledged charm and position should so frequently throw in their lot with Europeans who have nothing to offer compared with what they enjoy already.

ANARCHIST ASSASSIN ON TRIAL

For Attempting to Murder King Leopold

HE DENOUNCES SOCIETY

Large Crowds Attend—Significant Unionist Victory in Antrim on Land Question.
