Rough Riders Thunder To 28-6 Victory

TORONTO, Nov. 26 (CP)—Ottawa's tremendous tanks are rolling down the road that leads to the National Senior Football Championship and Sarnia and Winnipeg will need more than bravery to stop them.

The Rough Riders—alert, resourceful and swift for all their size—thundered to the Big Four championship in a 28-6 victory over Toronto's brave Argonauts before 19,200 persons in Varsity Stadium Saturday. They detoured the dominant champions of the last two years by 39-6 on the two-game, total-points round.

The display of power brought them into the eastern final against Sarnia's perennial champions of the Ontario union, with the right to meet Winnipeg Blue Bombers for the dominion title at stake.

The Imperials held all the aces in Montreal, as they forced Montreal Westmounts into the discard with an 18-13 triumph. The Imperials won 31-14 on the two-game, total-points round.

Black Hawks Win Over Red Wings; Canadiens Lose First

DETROIT, Nov. 26 (CP)—Chicago Black Hawks scored a pair of third period goals tonight to defeat Detroit Red Wings 4-2 in a National Hockey League game. It was the second game in two nights for the Red Wings who beat Canadiens 6-4 last night in Montreal.

Twice Detroit came from behind to tie the Hawks, who counted their first goals 10 seconds after the game started.

Johnny Gottselig broke a 2-2 deadlock at 11:58 in the third period with a high shot from near the blue line that goalie Tiny Thompson argued should have been disallowed. He claimed the puck bounced off Cully Dahlstrom's chest. As the Red Wings rushed futilely in the last minute, Dahlstrom broke away for the final goal.

Both of Detroit's markers and one of Chicago's came while the opposition was short handed. Gus Giesebrecht tied the count at one-all in the second period after Des Smith was sent off for tripping. After Ralph Bowman was chased for interference, Joffre Desilets, who had scored Chicago's first goal, again with a long drive that dipped under Thompson's glove.

Desilets was penalized for interference seconds before the second period ended, and Carl Liscombe smashed a 30-footer past Mike Karakas into the Chicago net; just as the Hawk forward returned to the ice in the last canto.

Bruins And Rangers Play To 2-2 Draw

BOSTON, Nov. 26 (CP)—Boston Bruins and New York Rangers met for the first time since last October 22, and the Bruins played to a 2-2 overtime draw in a National Hockey League game.

Outstanding in Boston's accomplishments was the scoring of Eddie Shore's first goal of the season. The veteran scorer, who filled in once more at a centre post for the Bruins, scored at 8:20 in the third period.

The spotlight shone as well on Hero Olan, the Bruins' third line wing, who rammed the first Boston goal past Kerr in the second period and was credited with an assist on Shore's tally.

Shore's center gave Boston a 2-1 lead, which the Bruins enjoyed for less than two minutes, the Rangers knocking the count with a tally by Clint Smith at 11:11.

New York (opened the scoring in the second period when Bryan Hexberg took the rubber down in a solo fight and beat Eimsek at 12:21. Cain evened matters at 14:30 in the same period, when Shore laid a pass on his stick after Art Jackson had whipped the disc to the veteran from behind the Ranger net.

Maple Leafs Take First Defeat As Americans Win 2-1

NEW YORK, Nov. 26 (CP)—New York Americans brought an end to two streaks tonight, beating Toronto Maple Leafs 2-1 in overtime for their first victory of the National Hockey League season and the Leafs' first defeat after five wins and a tie.

The Americans, who lost their sixth straight to the Leafs in Toronto Saturday night, held a 1-0 lead when Sweeney Schriner tied the game with only nine seconds to play. After little more than a minute of overtime, Eddie Wiseman fired the winner from close-up after Tommy Anderson and Johnny Sorrell set up the play outside the Leaf net.

Lorne Carr had put the Americans ahead the first time, scoring early in the third period after the teams battled through two scoreless sessions.

More than 12,000 fans watched the Americans hand the league leaders their first beating in a ragged, slow game marked by the New Yorker's care to protect their goal. They did it perfectly except for the second in which Schriner was allowed to bat a rebound over Earl Robertson.

Winter Olympic Games Are Abandoned

BRUSSELS, Nov. 24 (AP)—The 1940 winter Olympic Games, doomed from the start of the war, have been abandoned and will not be transferred elsewhere from Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany. Count Henri de Baillet-Latour, president of the International Olympic Committee, announced today.

Latour's announcement followed an earlier one from German Olympic officials, Skiers and Bob-Sledders because of the rule forbidding a warring nation to stage the games.
