

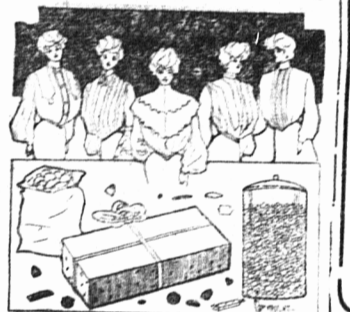

Dash off while on the railroad, or Stanley in the ice. And give it to the paper, and that will be so nice.

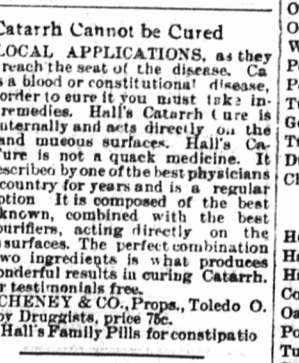
