Railroad Issues
Cling To Spotlight
On N. Y. Exchange

NEW YORK, Dec. 10—(AP)—
Railroad issues clinging to the spot-
light as the best in the stock mar-
ket today, carrying the load as
share prices registered their third
successive average advance.

The Associated Press 60-stock
composite was ahead 1/4 of a point
at 63.4.

Canadian issues were generally
higher. Dome Mines was up 1-2
while Canadian Pacific and Dis-
tillers Seagrams added 1-8. Mc-
Intyre gained 1-4. Hiram Walker
was down 1-2.

On the curb, Lake Shore was up
3-8 and Giant Yellowknife was
unquoted.

Total transactions of 1,200,000
(million) shares, slightly above
Tuesday's 1,070,000, made it
the third million-share day
since Nov. 19.

Texas Gulf production reached
a new 1947 high and finished up
2 1/4 at 19 1/4 reflecting crude oil
price advances. Santa Fe at 83 1/2
was ahead 1 1/4; New Haven Pre-
ferred up 7-8 at 19 1/4; J. I. Case
traded ex-dividend was up 1 7/8
at 44 1/4. Fractional gains were
retained by New York Central,
Pennsylvania Railroad, Northern
Pacific, International Paper,
Pepsi-Cola, Paramount Pictures,
J. C. Penney, U. S. Steel, Chrysler
International Harvester, American
Smelting and Johns-Manville. On
its first sale since Aug. 27, follow-
ing a \$125.00 dividend declaration
and a new 1947 high of 500, a
jump of 57 1/2.

New 1947 lows were touched by
Chesapeake and Ohio, which closed
at 28 1/2 at 40, 7-8 and by Pub-
lic Service of N. J., down 3-4 at
19 1/2. Other laggards included
United Fruit at 52 1/2, Bell Air
at 15 1/8, American Can at 79,
International Nickel at 26 1/4 and
Du Pont at 182.

Firm Undertone
In Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL, Dec. 10—(CP)—A
firm undertone prevailed among
selected issues on the stock ex-
change and curb market today.
Increases were only fractional on a
quiet market. Mines sought

changed at 77.12. Approximate in-

slightly lower than yesterday's vol-
