YESTERDAY'S MARKET—Butter sold at 38c; eggs 50c; chickens \$1.25 to \$1.35; ducks \$1.25; geese \$2 to \$2.50; apples 12c; Hay 70 to 75c; straw 45c; oats 35c to 40c; turnips 18c; potatoes 35 to 40c. There was a good offering of fresh cod, but no haddock.

NEW SOCIAL HALL—St. Paul's Church now boasts of a new basement hall where teas, bazaars and other social functions may be held without the usual confusion attending the preparation of the upper hall in the school room which has been generally used. The new quarters are in the basement. This space about 50 x 60 feet has been remodelled the walls, ceiling and new flooring put down. A number of ceiling lights have also been placed in position which gives ample illumination for use at night. In addition a convenient kitchen with a new Record range supplemented by a jacket heater for heating water and also serving as a warming oven. A feature of the kitchen is the counter reaching into the social hall, where dishes with food are passed to the waitresses, eliminating the necessity of the ladies entering the kitchen to carry out the orders for their patrons. In the kitchen is also a large cupboard with dishes on the upper shelves, while below the cutlery and linens are stored. Hot and cold water above the sink; fat dish washing is another great convenience noted.

WATER SITUATION SERIOUS—Early yesterday morning it was discovered that reservoir supplying the city with water had gone quite dry. Mr. J. A. Webster, Mr. J. A. MacMillan, the manager, and Mr. Stanley Matheson, mechanical superintendent, drove immediately to the pumping station. The pumps were then working and there was a gradual inflow, and by 7 a. m. there was a foot of water in the reservoir, the lowest in the history of the system. Normally there should be eight feet. One foot, it is stated, gives only about twenty pounds pressure and in the event of a fire breaking out, this pressure would be practically useless. Mr. Webster further states that when the first warning was given of a shortage of the supply, the citizens gave a wonderful response and the consumption was greatly decreased. About ten days ago rain came and that improved the situation to some extent, but the consumption of water greatly increased. Since the rain, however the supply has been steadily decreasing until the situation is now very serious. All the big consumers have been notified, including the garages, the school children have all been appealed to, and everything possible has been done to conserve the supply. The fullest cooperation of every citizen is necessary if a calamity in the event of fire, is to be averted. It is expected that in about three weeks the new source of supply will be available and that the danger attendant on the shortage will be over.

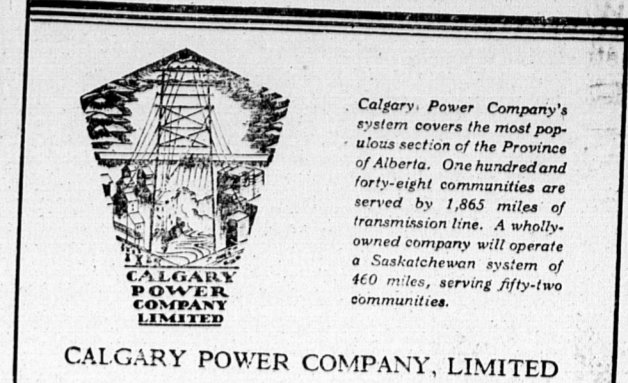
