to study under the guidance of Matthew, the publican-Jew, who wrote specifically for the Jews to convince them that Jesus was the Messiah of their age-long expectation and fondest dreams and hopes, by reason of the promise made to Abraham.

The first thing discovered to us in such a study is that Jesus had a fore-runner as heroic and self-renouncing as Paul proved himself to be as a follower. What a character of simple and imposing grandeur is outlined by the gospel writers in the person of John the Baptist! Look at him!

Repent! This is the first word which greets men at the door of any new enterprise or of any marked and worthy development of one of which the principles and promises have been laid. It is a word of startling and penetrating and resistless wake-up and get-up (perhaps, also turn-about) of the conscientious and well-balanced soul. To others, who will hear, it means a charge of wrong-doing and the demand to right-about-face.

There are always those who believe themselves fully equipped and altogether meritorious enough to join anything. They are "it," like the Pharisees and Sadducees who came to John's baptism. There are many of them in the churches now. Their object in joining any new movement is in order that they may be still more "it."

Preachers discern them now, as John Baptist did then. Alas, the stern stuff is often lacking to meet them as he did. But the self-satisfied and socially and religiously aristocratic must suffer from some one at some time a rude awakening.

The beauty of the character of John Baptist, his humility and meekness must not be overlooked because of the admiration which his rugged courage inspires. Where can a finer lesson in self-renunciation be read, except at the Cross, than that which pays tribute to the Christ, in verses, eleven and similar passages? It is the testimony of a faithful fore-runner. The herald is not the King.

All the service of the lives of devoted men has for its object to set the right of way and a good way for the way of the Lord.—Onward.
