**Grain Unsteady In Chicago**

CHICAGO, Sept. 16—(O.P.)—In a late reaction, wheat underwent a tumble of about 2-3 cents after a rise of more than a cent above yesterday's close. Rallies quickly ensued, however, and the market closed even with yesterday.

Enlarged speculative selling and an easier tone in securities had a bearish effect. On the other hand, Canadian advices said 2,500,000 bushels of wheat here would soon be moved to eastern lake ports.

Wheat closed nervous, 1-8 off to 1-8 up compared with yesterday's finish, corn 1-4-1-2 advanced, oats at 1-4 decline to 1-8 gain, and provisions varying from 10 cents setback to a rise of 7 cents.

**COMMISSION COMPLETES OPEN MEETINGS**

**Royal Commission On Banking Begins Work On Preparing Report.**

OTTAWA, Sept. 17—(O.P.)—Public sittings of the Royal Commission on Banking concluded here Friday. Just 5 weeks and 3 days from the date that Lord Macmillan and his four colleagues gathered in the Dominion Parliament buildings for their first public hearing, they completed their open meetings. In the interval Canada has been toured. Every Province of the Dominion has rendered its quota of verbal and written opinion on banking, financial and economic problems. The Commission now settles down to the heavy task of perusal and selection of "separating the wheat from the chaff," as its Chairman has said, and of compiling a report based upon essentials.

The Commission closed on a note of appreciation of what has been done thus far and its manner of doing. Prime Minister R. B. Bennett attended the final hearing, thanked Lord Macmillan and his colleagues for their efforts, and expressed particular appreciation of the fact that the Chairman and Sir Charles Addis had interrupted their summer vacation to come and sit on the Commission. The House of Commons, he said, would go on record "in a more formal way" in expressing the thanks of the Canadian people.

Mr. Bennett commented that the wide experience of the Commissioners would enable them to separate theories from practical banking, which he considered important. Lord Macmillan also had words of high appreciation for the help which has been given to the Commission during its period of activity. It must now consider the material collected, and draw conclusions therefrom. He hoped that these would be of a character to assist the Dominion toward recovery and ultimate prosperity.
