MAN Y CHINESE KILLED IN BATTLE

PEKIN, Dec. 24.—Marshall Feng Yu Hsiang's national army troops entered Tientsin this morning after several days fighting in which thousands were killed or wounded. The troops of Gen. Li Ching, civil governor of Chihli and Feng's enemy are fleeing in disorder. Chaos reigns in the native quarter of Tientsin where soldiers attached to the defeated army are engaged in looting. Foreign volunteers and troops are protecting the gates of the foreign settlement which is barricaded. Feng's supporter Sun Ueh has been appointed civil governor of Chihli to succeed Li. A work train has left Peking to repair the railway which has been closed to traffic for two weeks owing to the fighting.
