The schooner *Turbine* sailed yesterday with a cargo of 50,000 bushels of oats for London, Eng. The ship was loaded under the personal supervision of the charterer Captain Joseph Read in less than four days.

The schooner *Warren W.*, Capt. Porrier arrived at Montague, on Monday and cleared on Wednesday for Halifax. Her cargo consisted of 1500 bushels of oats, 3000 bushels of potatoes and 4000 bushels of turnips.

CAMBRIDGE, Dec. 10.—Further particulars regarding the disappearance of Ida Guthrie of P. E. Island are: When she failed to return Saturday night inquiries at the house to which she had been sent revealed the fact that the child had not been there at all, and it was supposed that her absence was voluntary. Later it has been learned that Ida was seen by a female companion after 5 p.m. Saturday and stated to her friend that she was performing an errand for a neighbor in the purchase of some groceries.

The name of the neighbor was not given, and all efforts to obtain her identity have proved futile. As she had always been anxious to work and then earn wages for the support of the family, it is presumed that she was being paid for the chore in which she was engaged, and that negatives the idea of her entertaining any intention of running away.

The family are greatly distressed over the child's disappearance, now believing it not to be her own volition.

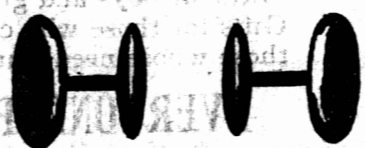
THE PEOPLE WILL VOTE.

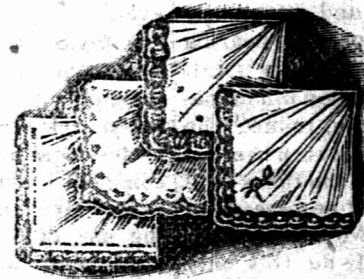
