It has been very pleasing to read the many able and convincing anti-auto letters also, the many strong and pointed resolutions, from all over the Island that have appeared in the Guardian. But it has been equally unpleasant to read the letters of the Autoists. They have not given one sensible reason, why autos should be allowed to run on our roads. There is no use disguising the fact that our road way proper, is narrow, and this of necessity, as owing to the sticky nature of most of our soil, the driveway must have a good round to throw off the water, and the narrower the road, the easier to keep round. It is said that farmers are selfish. (Not so, they are perfectly willing that everyone should use the roads as freely as themselves, but with the same vehicles and the same propelling power. Now there is a law on our statute books. (See Sections 53 & 54 of road Act.) "No person shall place an obstruction, or a nuisance on the public highway and etc." and Road Masters are ordered to have same removed, and any damage caused by said nuisance made good. Penalty of \$20.00 or one month imprisonment for each offence. Now farmers consider autos an "obstruction" and a nuisance." (which they certainly are), therefore they cannot be allowed to be placed on our roads. The disinterested letter, written from England by the Rev. Mr. Styles, (and published in the Guardian), while on a visit there last summer about the unbearable nuisance that autos have become there, ought to be sufficient warning for us, to "keep them out" of our Provinces. Some of the other buyers who come here from the other side, have said that we were wise in not allowing them to run, and that where they have been allowed, they were forced on the people. Farmers are the only producers, Business men, lawyers, doctors and etc., have to depend on them for their "bread and butter." Therefore the producers must be protected; if not they will protect themselves. Let these men run them in the towns if they want to, but not in the country, please! Every ratepayer "should attend the Annual School Meeting, but let them make it a special point to attend this one on the 17th, and roll up such an anti-auto vote that will settle this "annual" nuisance for a long time to come.

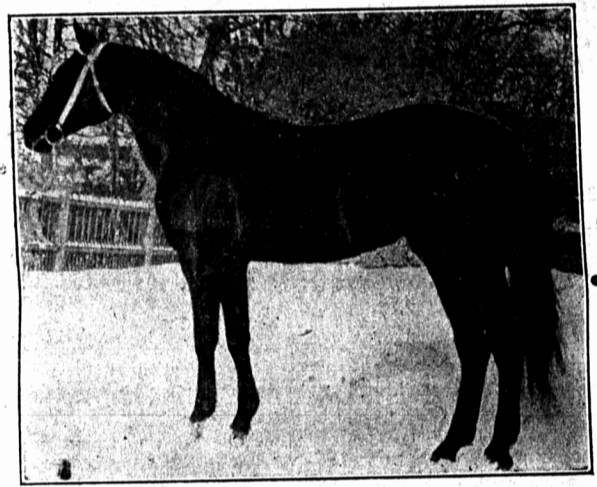

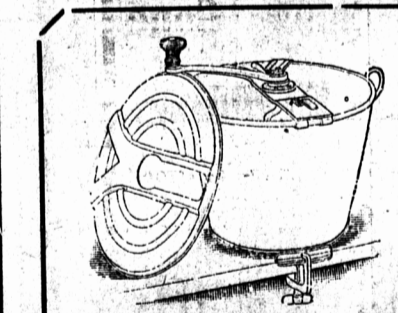

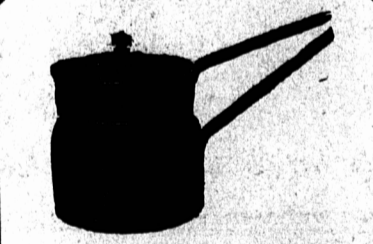
