He was very fond of horses and would take a hand at driving the bus or anything that brought him in touch with man's noblest friend of the animal world. He was also fond of dogs, and someone in the vicinity of the Plank House (it may have been Dr. Hillock V. S. had a good specimen of coach dog.)

A woman mesmerist came to town one day and engaged the old Ontario Hall for a show. Pick had driven her to the hotel. A lot of the young fellows of town answered an invitation to go on the platform that night and he mesmerized, and she soon had them busy at their favorite or customary occupation. Pick was driving horses with much vim. We forget what the others were doing, but finally the stage was supposed to be on fire and the boys scrambled in alarm to get out of danger. The only way to escape seemed to be over the partition into the dressing room. The taller ones had no difficulty but Johnny Crawford was short and it took a desperate struggle for him to get over.

The show was repeated and Pick was again the star performer. Supposed to be the hall for his favorite animal and soon returned with a bag on his back. Reaching the stage the sack was opened and out came—the coach dog! It was a matter of guessing for some time whether the woman was a good mesmerist or Pick a good actor. We heard a hint somewhere that, preliminary to the show, and after an interview with the lady, Pick had mesmerized his friends, the boys, for her. However, it was a harmless lark, which even the sedate mayor of a city might look back on without shame.

Mr. Brown travelled a good deal and saw a bit of the world before settling on the Isle near the sea.

large a way before the methods and precautions necessary were understood. The loss in labor may have been great and discouragement resulted. It should be started in a small way in order that the outlay is almost negligible and the amount under berries increased gradually until a maximum for the farm is reached whether it be 1/2, 1, 2 or 3 acres. In this way the markets can also be gradually developed.

Many are depending a good deal upon one or two particular phases of their farm production for their income and occasionally one may fail. Would it not be a good experiment to add another channel for income? Many families can do all their own picking, packing, weeding, planting, etc. for a reasonable area and it is doubtful if any other feature of farm production will repay in such a satisfactory way if properly managed.

The Provincial Department of Agriculture under the Federal Grant is prepared to give assistance by advising on location and preparation of beds, the securing of proper varieties
