-UNCOMMON SPECIES—two small fishermen fishing in Bedeque Bay have found in their nets an uncommon fish, which they say has never been seen here before. The fish is described in the encyclopedia as the saury, bill fish or skipper. The most peculiar thing about it is its long thin bill or beak which is almost two inches long and looks like two darning needles one a little longer than the other. The fish grows to about eighteen inches long although the specimen which was caught by Mr. Heckbert and which is on display in Emman's Drug Store is only a foot long. It is of an olive color with a silver ridge along the back. Its fins are rather small. The fish is usually found in the Atlantic waters and is of the herring species. It has somewhat the appearance of a sprat, a small fish caught extensively in the North Sea. The one caught by Mr. Heckbert is a perfect specimen and has caused a good deal of interest.—S


