SYDNEY'S PROSPECTS.

It seems now extremely probable that Sydney and not Halifax or St. John will be chosen as the site for the works of the steel ship-building company. Both the larger ports of the Maritime Province, fully convinced of the great advantage that would result, have made bold and generous bids to secure the prize, but it is now believed that their tempting proposals will be declined. The President of the Dominion Iron and Steel Company, strongly supported by Mr. Moxham, appears to have convinced the shipbuilding people that Sydney possesses superior advantages sufficient to offset the bonuses and tax-exemptions offered by Halifax and St. John.

These advantages may be mentioned as first the presence on the spot of the metal and the coal required in the work of constructing ships; secondly the desirability of having the works of the shipbuilding company located together with the extensive works of the steel and coal companies, as many of the stock-holders are interested in two or all three of these great enterprises; and finally it seems probable that Sydney will yet be made the western terminal port for the Atlantic steamship line to connect Canada with the Mother Country. It is also now said that if the ship building plant is located at Sydney its promoters have been promised an immediate contract for the construction of three of the finest ocean grey-hounds on the coast, the same to constitute the nucleus of the coming British Canadian Atlantic line.

As is well known, Sydney possesses the advantage of being nearer to Europe than either Halifax or St. John, and it is to be made a principal terminal port for Canadian trade across the Atlantic the necessity will exist for works adapted to dock and repair as well as to build ships at that place. All these indications point to making Sydney a first class Canadian port, and the expenditure there not only of the capital of the vast industrial enterprises alluded to but of large sums of Government money to equip, and ultimately to fortify the port. Thus the outlook for the future of the Cape Expedition includes great possibilities in addition to the splendid certainties already assured. The Sydney boom has evidently not yet attained its full proportions.

We view with satisfaction the sustained and brightening prospects of Sydney, which port has already developed a valuable market for our Island products. As Sydney grows and develops the market will be proportionally enlarged and enhanced in value, and no one of the three Eastern Provinces can so cheaply and profitably supply it with the products of the farm. We have a further interest in the fact that a considerable number of our Island people have already located at Sydney and their welfare as merchants, business men and workers are bound up with the growth and development of the town. At present the prospects are very assuring and all indications point to Sydney becoming in the near future one of the great if not the greatest of industrial and commercial centres of Eastern Canada.

The decision of Judge Archibald of Quebec, that at the Delpit marriage is valid, notwithstanding it had been declared null by the ecclesiastical court, is but one of a number of Quebec judicial decisions. notice given of appeal from Judge Archibald's judgment in the Delpit case. In any case appeal can only be made on the part of Mr. Delpit, and it is doubtful whether he will undertake it. A decision of the Privy Council seems most desirable in view of the conflicting judgments of lower courts, and the important interests at stake.

On Mr. Blair is reported to have contracted with the new Steel Company of Sault Ste. Marie for 125,000 tons of steel rails in October last, some considerable time before the new works can be in operation. It is said moreover that the price has since fallen and hence the company will have a very favorable contract. The defence that the contract was given to encourage home industry reads very like an old-time defence of the National Policy, but our parties are getting much mixed in the increasing similarity of their fiscal policies.
