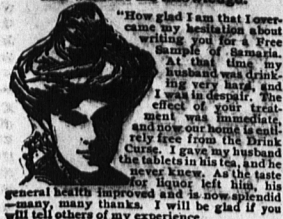

HISTORY OF C. E. MOVEMENT

The Twenty-Fifth Anniversary Just Celebrated—The Principle of the Organization—The Four Great Objects Set Before the C. E. Societies.

Propos of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the founding of the Christian Endeavor Society, which was celebrated last month, several of the February magazines have articles outlining the remarkable history of this unique movement. Perhaps the most noteworthy of these articles is that contributed to the North American Review by President Henry B. F. MacFarland, of the Board of Commissioners of the District of Columbia, who is himself an enthusiastic Endeavorer. The story of how this great society had its humble origin is told in the Review of Reviews. Mr. MacFarland declares with truth that no present-day philosophy can ignore the significance of such an organization as the Christian Endeavor Society, which is of immense value, not only to the individual church or to the individual State but as an interdenominational and international league, binding the churches together, and binding the States together with the invisible ties of sympathy, affection and a good purpose.

The basic principle of the organization, retained consistently from the beginning under the flexible plan of the founder, is that the active members shall both attend and take part in meetings, and shall as faithfully carry on the various kinds of work, always in and through the parent church and the leadership of its pastor. It could hardly have been in the mind of the founder, Dr. Francis E. Clark, a quarter of a century ago, that Christian Endeavor principles would ever be applied so generally throughout the world; but as Mr. MacFarland points out, aptly has been equal to the problem. There are now associates as well as active members. These associates, while not church members, are willing to attend the meetings. In the division of work everybody is given something definite to do, committees having been organized to

cover every variety of possible endeavor in and out of the Church. The society's adaptation to all races as well as all churches and ages is indeed remarkable. The four great objects set before the societies of Christian Endeavor at the last convention, in Baltimore, were these: 1. That they give \$1,000,000 to denominational missions. 2. That they should bring into the Church one million new church attendants. 3. That they should induce one million persons to join the church. 4. That they should bring one million new members into the Christian Endeavor societies. One outcome of the present widespread celebration of this quarter-centennial anniversary is to be a memorial in the form of a building for the international headquarters of the national society, the fund for its maintenance to be provided by the gifts of Christian Endeavorers.

JAPS PARTICULAR ABOUT DETAILS

A British Attache Thinks They Pay Too Much Attention to Little Matters—But Experience Has Shown That They Have Perfect Organization.

MONTREAL, March 20.—Captain C. A. Yate, one of the military attaches representing the British army, who accompanied the Japanese forces during the recent war with Russia and witnessed several of the most important engagements, is on his way home to England. He came over from Japan by the steamer Kanagawa Maru.

At the Windsor Captain Yate stated that his reports to the war office had long since preceded him, and it was not his business to offer criticism through the newspapers. Except on two points he had nothing but praise and admiration to offer as to the military organization of Japan. What he considered an element of weakness rather than strength was the waste of valuable hours, that were spent by the staff going over plans that had already been fully worked out, and that benefited in no way from the minute and scrupulous exactitude with which every detail was gone through and checked many times before being finally acted upon. Then as to cavalry there could be no disputing the fact that Japan was weak in that arm. The horses were poor and entirely insufficient in numbers as in quality. This weakness would have been bound to be serious if the long run had the war continued, but Japan was singularly successful in concealing her weakest spot from the enemy.

"But as regards efficiency of organization," said Captain Yate, "I can only describe the Japanese war department as astonishing. One of its most noteworthy features was the leaving of the 'channel of command' free and open. The Japanese system is very much like the German in that regard. Nothing could have worked more smoothly or more perfectly. Another feature that struck me as of unusual excellence was the management of the telephone in field work and the results obtained from photography were unquestionably of the greatest assistance in enabling the Japanese to concentrate upon the points where the enemy's strategic position was weak."

Speaking of the present famine in Japan, Captain Yate said it was in two prefectures in the northeast part of Centre Island that the distress and destitution was greatest. Some had died and some were dying, and the extremity of the people was so great they were using ferns, bracken and furze in the form of food preparations—their ordinary articles of food being completely exhausted. Partial relief was being sent out from Tokio when he left, but it was to be feared that the people would be in a condition of great distress until the next crops were reaped, at the close of summer.
